- Suggestion: lives in the catalog
- Evaluations page in contract? Might be vague in contract.
 - Language from contract: Provides course syllabi with information concerning course objectives, student learning outcomes, methods of evaluation and grading policies, and information requested by the division.
- Suggestion: table for now
- Question: can textbooks be required/recommended as part of this policy?
 - No, this should come from Dean

- Question: Would this depend on if this is an 8 week or 16 week course?
- Suggestion: "By the first Friday of the semester for 16 week and within 72 hours of the start of the session for 8 week courses"
- Suggestion: add "by accepting this add code you are responsible for all past assignments"
- Question: why can't students self-enroll during Week 1 so that add codes aren't necessary?
- We may get automated add codes by Winter 2023
- Question: How can we make sure the Division and the faculty member aren't double adding students?
- Question: What about summer and winter?
 - Suggestion:
 - 48 hours for 5/6 week classes, Winter semester
 - 72 hours for 8 week classes
