- Enrollment Management: College Marketing Efforts




### b. Vice President, Compton College: Paul Flor

VP Flor had a scheduling conflict; no report.

- c. Chair, Curriculum Committee: Janet Young: Dr. Young reported that the College Curriculum Committee has reviewed 159 courses and 40 certificates all while CurricUNET was broken! No wonder Dr. Young is Dr. Shankweiler's hero! Dr. Young deflected the praise to her committee which she said has completed a herculean task!
- d. VP Educational Policies: Chris Gold: Dr. Gold noted that the work of the Ed Policies Committee would be discussed in the New Business section.

VP Faculty Development, Stacey Allen: Professor Allen reported that the Informed and Inspired series wrapped up with workshops addressing the needs of our Veteran students. Thanks to Anna Brochet for helping coordinate that series! The Outstanding Adjunct Faculty Award will be presented later in the meeting.

On page 19 of the packet is a copy of a very preliminary draft of the revised flex credit matrix. As a result of concerns brought to the Senate in the spring semester, the Faculty Development Committee was asked to form a subcommittee to look at the flex processes and procedures. That group has been working since September and has dramatically revamped the document to make it more user-friendly. The categories have been reduced from 9 to 4 and are now tied into the ECC Strategic Initiatives. The subcommittee will also be working to develop an appeals process which will address questions and concerns when applications for flex credit are denied. A working group is reviewing AP 7160 Professional Development to address concerns about faculty purview related to professional development.





- f. VP Finance & Special Projects: Josh Troesh: PBC had a light agenda because the committee was reviewing their evaluation.
- g. VP Academic Technology: Pete Marcoux: No report; the College Technology Committee did not meet.
- h. VP Instructional Effectiveness: Russell Serr: Faculty should be entering their fall assessments into TracDat. Final revisions for Fall 2017 Program Review documents should be submitted soon. Those scheduled for Program Review in 2018 should be starting their work.







ECC VP of Academic Affairs – Jean Shankweiler: The Guided Pathways Summit is open to all faculty, staff and students. Registration is currently open on Flex Reporter. The self-assessment goes to the Board of Trustees in December. We are waiting for additional guidance from the chancellor's office and the funding comes through in April.

Accreditation team leaders have been selected and are listed in the packet. Thanks to Irene Graff, Josh Troesh, and Russel Serr for cochairing standards and a special thank you to Claudia Striepe for her willingness to co-chair the entire process.

**ECC VP of Academic Affairs – Jean Shankweiler:** Hiring has been underway so we will have a number of new administrators starting on January 2<sup>nd</sup>. These include: New deans for BSS and I&T, a director for Library Learning Resources, Director of Public Safety (for instruction, not for Campus Police), and Director of Career Technical Education.

We are working on enrollments for winter and spring. 120 additional sections have been added for winter, above and beyond what was offered last winter. We can add sections for courses with full wait lists but students aren't necessarily interested in the timing for added courses.

Room scheduling software is on our very long wish list for technology. Cabinet needs to review the list and prioritize. Some new systems will be integrated but it's not imperative that all are (e.g., Timekeeper and CurricUNET).

ECC VP of Academic Affairs – Jean Shankweiler: Dr. Shankweiler was asked whether College Night was helping with enrollment. We will need to track attendees in order to know. When asked what faculty can do to help, Dr. Shankweiler asked that they tell students about deadlines and that they familiarize themselves with resources so they can effectively refer students. Also, help students figure out how to get a counseling appointment – it can be challenging. Faculty were encouraged to reach out to their division reps or to the division office to arrange counselor visits to their classrooms. KDD will request a listing of counselors assigned to each division so faculty can reach out to their particular counselor.





**ECC VP of Student Services – Ross Miyashiro:** A student recruiting module will be in place in spring 2018. This will track students from their first expression of interest.

Starfish and early alert systems are in production. In fall 2018, a response team will be in place which will respond to faculty referrals and report back to faculty on progress assisting students. The goal is to keep students enrolled, making sure they succeed.

With South Bay Promise, the goal is to make sure we can scale up from the current number of participants. The target is 500 students in fall 2018, but depending on how many qualify for the Board of Governor's Fee Waiver, that number may be increased to 850.

### a. El Camino College Local Minimum Qualifications: 1st Reading – Chris Gold

This is the list we refer to when hiring new faculty. Current faculty can also apply to teach in another discipline. This list has been difficult to locate; it's like one of the college's best-kept secrets. The goal is to post it online, making sure it's not only available but also used consistently. Our list must meet the state minimums but we can also exceed the state list. The review process started in Ed Policies in spring semester but it quickly became clear we needed a separate task force. VPs from Academic Affairs and Human Resources, as well as union reps participated. The list has been reorganized so it's easier to read. Any discipline changes have gone through the relevant department. We will add a note to indicate that our MQs for Communication Studies is higher than the state MQs. Deans will view this concurrently as the Senate reviews it, in the interest of time. Please take time to look it over carefully and send any questions or comments to Chris before our next meeting so she can research answers and bring them back for our second reading.

AP 7211 Faculty Service Areas, Minimum Qualifications & Equivalencies: 1st Reading – Chris Gold: Applicants may have equivalent preparation that equals the MQs. This procedure addresses those situations. The original version of this is in the packet. The Ed Policies Committee started with the existing process and merged it with the CCLC template. We are legally required to have this so it's good that this was a priority for this semester. The marked-up copy shows what was changed and what's the same. We used a lot of language from the template.

AP 7211 Faculty Service Areas, Minimum Qualifications & Equivalencies: 1st Reading – Chris Gold: The Ed Policies Task Force (which had representatives from Academic Affairs, Human Resources, and the union) felt it was important to raise the minimum number of graduate units required to 18 from 12. If someone has a bachelors and masters in English and decides to make a career change to teach math, the task force felt it was important that they have more than 12 units before teaching a college class. Also, for those not having a masters but instead having 30 units, the change was made to indicate that those units should be in a related discipline.

AP 7211 Faculty Service Areas, Minimum Qualifications & Equivalencies: 1st Reading – Chris Gold:


It was asked whether those granted equivalency before the establishment of this procedure would be grandfathered in. The answer is yes. It was suggested that this be noted in the procedure.

FSAs have more to do with lay-offs than hiring. All of those are housed in the contract.

Chris was thanked for the *extraordinary* amount of work she did to lead the review and revision of the MQs and the equivalency procedure. The meeting packet makes it evident that, like our Curriculum updates this semester, this was another herculean task. And there was even more work that occurred behind the scenes during spring, summer and this semester.


