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**Course Review**

J. Baranski updated History 105 (Women and American History from the Colonial Era to 1877), changing the objective assessments, textbook, as well as minor changes to IV. D., V. and VI. John updated the objective assessments, outline of subject matter, and textbook for History 108 (United States History: The American Indian Experience). History 145 (History of World Religions) has minor change with updated textbook. All three history courses were approved by the committee. L. Houske will forward them to the CCC.

Political Science 5 (Ethnicity in the American Political Process) L. Houske reported that it was in good shape and only needed a textbook update. DCC approved and moved to forward course to CCC.

A. Simon reviewed Psychology 8 (Social Psychology). PSYC 5H was added to the prerequisite and the textbook was updated. PSYC 9A/SOCI 109A was updated by R. Mascolo. The catalog description, objectives and assessments, outline of subject matter, and textbook were updated. PSYC 9A is cross-listed with SOCI 109 was given a new number--109A. All changes were approved and courses to be forwarded by L. Houske to the CCC.

**Course Reactivation**

The DCC reviewed SOCI 110 (Introduction to Social Work) for reactivation. The recommended preparation was changed from SOCI 104 to 101. M. Fujiwara updated the catalog description, objectives and assessments, and textbook. Also, submitted for reactivation by H. Herrera Thomas was HIST 114 (History of the Asian American in the United States). Only minor revisions were needed, IV. D., textbook, and assessments were updated. Both reactivations were approved.

**Revision**

J. Young reported on revisions made to new course, CDEV 100. Supervised tutoring was discussed. Also, with the creation of the new three-unit course, CDEV 165 and the inactivation of Child Development 160, 163, and 166 the certificate of achievement for Early Intervention Assistant and Special Education Assistant were updated to reflect these changes.
