COR Ready for Course Review

- American Studies 7 was approved with textbook updated to 2012. “discipline standard” was added.
- Human Development 115 was approved with Sukiennik textbook updated to 2015. The Michelozzi and Lock textbooks were removed. *Grit: The Power and Passion of Perseverance*, 2016 was added.
