Program Level SLOs

S. Allen led a discussion on the department's program level SLO assessments for this semester. The wording of the existing program level SLO was modified as follows:

Given a social scenario students will use primary and/or secondary sources to objectively analyze the influence of society on the individual.

Deleted was the last part of the sentence: "and the influence of the individual on society."

Relevant courses to assess were reconfirmed as Sociology 101 and 104. S. Allen then asked if her colleagues could share the grades assigned for pertinent assignments in either of these two courses that reflect the program level SLO. She will need those grades within one week.

S. Allen also asked the faculty to rethink the mapping of core competencies that were first completed at the spring semester flex day meeting.

Associate Degrees/Major

G. Miranda discussed her plan to convene a small division subcommittee to review the existing A.A. degree major requirements for each discipline within the Behavioral and Social Sciences Division. She plans to compile information on CSU and UC Sociology requirements during the summer months for review by faculty in fall 2010.
