Start a Career in Commercial Truck Driving

Help wanted! There is a critical workforce shortage of truck drivers at our heavily-congested ports. According to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, the Los Angeles, Long Beach, Anaheim and Riverside, San Bernardino, Ontario metropolitan areas rank amongst the highest in national employment demand for heavy and tractor-trailer truck drivers. With a median-average -hourly wage of \$28.40 and even higher-average-hourly wages of \$42.55, now is the time to start a lucrative and exciting career in transportation. In California, you may be hired to drive a commercial motor vehicle (CMV) carrying cargo that originates and terminates within state lines if you are at least 18 years old, and to drive for interstate commerce or transport hazardous materials/waste if you're 21 or older. In either scenario, you need to hold a Commercial Driver's License (CDL) in order to drive a Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV).

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

El Camino College Community Education department's program provides a 3-part approach to train you for a California Commercial Learner's Permit (CLP) and prepare you to pass the DMV behindthe-wheel exam to earn your Class A Commercial Driver's License (CDL). Once you obtain your Class A California Commercial Driver's License, you will be eligible for entry-level employment positions in the trucking industry. The program is all-inclusive priced at \$5,995. This registration fee includes all class materials, usage of truck for training and testing, and DMV permit/class A license fee. Part 1 prepares you for the knowledge tests to obtain your commercial learner's permit. Part 2 provides the hands-on behind-the-wheel Range training. Part 3 provides the hands-on behind-the-wheel Public Road training and testing at the DMV. Students will learn how to operate a CNG class 8 tractor and trailer. *Students that obtain their class "A" license will be issued a certificate of completion. Students may have the option to add-on optional endorsements. Additional fees may apply.*

NOTICE OF FEDERAL MOTOR CARRIER SAFETY ADMINISTRATION REQUIREMENTS:

State and federal regulations for commercial truck driving programs requires that students be listed in the FMCSA's training provider registry (TPR). Students won't be able to get a CDL if their training provider has not added them to the registry.

The El Camino College Community Education department's partners (i.e. Transportation Guidance & Assistance (TGA) Truck Driving School) complies with state and federal regulations:

3-PART PROGRAM

Part One: Commercial Learner's Permit (CLP) & Entry-Level Driver Training (ELDT)

Length: 2 weeks Hours: 32 hours Prerequisite: Meet enrollment requirements Location: El Camino College Classroom

Enables students to become familiar with regulations governing the operation of commercial vehicles and safe operational practices. This course follows state and federal guidelines for commercial driver training programs and is approved by the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration as an Entry Level Driver Training (ELDT) program. Participation in this course does not guarantee students will earn their Commercial Learner's Permit (CLP). Upon completion of this course, students must pass the written CLP test at a California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) office. Students must provide DMV with a number of documents including a 3-year driver history and a medical clearance.

Part Two: Behind-the-Wheel Range Operations

Length: 6 weeks Hours: 96 hours Prerequisite: Commercial Learners Permit (CLP), and Part 1 Location: ECC Parking Lot

This course is designed to prepare students for the range operations section of the California Commercial Motor Vehicle (CMV) License exam. Students will practice moving forward, straight-line backing, parallel parking, ally docking, and external/internal inspections (pre-trip inspection). *Students may be given the option to add optional endorsement training during this part of training. Students responsible for any additional fees.*

Part Three: Behind-the-Wheel Road Driving Skills

Length: 2

Hours: 32 hours

Prerequisite: Commercial Learners Permit (CLP), and successfully completed Part 2 of El Camino College's truck-driver training program.

Location: ECC Parking Lot

Students in this course will demonstrate safe CMV operation by driving a CMV with an instructor on public and private roads. Please note: This course includes individual appointments to the DMV–students use the same truck used in class to take their CDL driving test at the DMV. Behind-the-wheel range operations and pre- trip inspections will also be reviewed in part 3 in preparation for the CDL road exam.



ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS

To apply for the Class A Commercial Truck Driving Program, the following conditions must be met (FMCSA (Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration) §380.703(7)):

- Student must be at least 18 years old with a valid, non-expired, California class "C" drivers license
- Student must provide a copy of their DMV driving history (K-4 Printout) showing a driving record that meets requirements for obtaining the CDL permit and CDL license from the DMV.
- Student must attend the mandatory orientation per the California and federal Department of Transportation regulations. (Code of Federal Regulations, Title 49, Subtitle B, Chapter III, Subchapter B, Part 380, in effect Feb 7, 2022).
- Student must attend **all** class hours to complete driving history while in the program. Class hours are mandatory, tracked, and reported to the FMCSA.
- All student schedule changes must be requested and approved by the appropriate training staff.
- Students must contact the appropriate staff to report tardiness and absences immediately.
- Student agrees and understands that in order to pass all written and application examinations, they must receive a grade of 80% or higher.
 IMPORTANT:
- Per California state regulations, a student driver must complete a minimum of 15 hours behind-thewheel (combination of range and road) in order to sit for the CDL road examination at the DMV.
- Student must agree to provide a copy of their CLP (Commercial Learner's Permit) prior to commencement of part 2 and part 3 Behind-the-Wheel training(s).
- Student may be removed from the program, if permit is not obtained by the 2nd week.
- Student must complete Drug/Alcohol drug testing during week one of the course and may be asked to complete random substance testing through the duration of the course.
- Student understands that the following fees are not covered by the course enrollment fee and students are required to cover these fees or find a funding source (pricing subject to change/variation):
 - DMV K-4/Driving Record Printout \$5 (as of March 2023)
 - Obtainment of any required documentation (e.g Birth Certificate) and it's associated cost in relation to entering the program
 - Additional DMV fees for students that choose to complete the optional endorsements or any changes needed to the license obtained. See DMV site for fee details.
 - If applicable: medication, corrective lenses or any requirement needed to obtain a Department of Transportation (DOT) Physical
 - Parking: parking permit required to park on campus. Semester pass to be purchased at Bookstore or pay\$3 daily at any kiosk for a one-day pass. See parking handout for details.



COURSE FEE/PAYMENT:

The training fee is due upon registration. We accept cash, check made out to "El Camino College" or credit card (Visa, Mastercard or Discover). If you require assistance with this fee, the following are some suggested options. We also accept payments from grant programs and re-training vouchers from workers compensation claims. *Tuition fee does not include parking fees.*

REGISTRATION CONFIRMATION

An auto-generated confirmation and reminder email will be sent to you prior to start date. We will contact you by phone and email if the class is canceled or if there are any changes to your registration.

PROGRAM/TRAINING WITHDRAWAL

NO REFUNDS. If you request to withdraw from the program/training and the request is received by the Community Ed office three (3) business days prior to class start date, a credit voucher "store credit" valid for three(3) years will be granted, less a \$20 processing fee. Students that enroll through 3rd party funding will be processed according to the contract with the 3rd party.

CANCELLATION

If the College cancels a class for any reason, those pre-registered will be notified by phone and email and payment will be refunded. We also reserve the right to substitute instructors or reschedule class times if necessary.
