Moving in

- ▶ The new BSSC building is open starting today and you can move in.
- ▶ The BSS Division is now a two-building division. We currently have classes and faculty offices in both buildings.
- ▶ Communication Studies is currently still in offices and classrooms in Fine Arts, but they will be moving offices and classrooms into the SOCS building in Winter.
- ▶ The BSS Division will be filling both buildings - please spread the word.
- ▶ The BSS Division office is in the new BSSC building.

Moving in

- ▶ Keys and Parking Permits and Office/Classroom Supplies (Cecelia)
- ▶ Offices
 - ▶ Monitor Arm (We will remove them unless you would like to mount your own personal monitors. Let us know asap if you want to keep your monitor)
 - ▶ You have been assigned a desk, but please let us know if you and your office mate would like to swap desks so we can have your phone changed over to the other desk.
 - ▶ Check phones and garbage cans - let us know if your phone is not functioning or you are missing a garbage can.
 - ▶ Names on door - watch for an email in the upcoming week or two to ask what name you would like on your door. (Patience is a virtue - Facilities folks are BUSY.)
 - ▶ Tricky to unlock - Need to fully unlock and then pull a little and fully turn the key to lock it. I'll teach a few people and then you can teach each other.

- ▶ Classrooms

 - ▶ Faculty do not have their own room. Please understand that since most faculty don't have full loads on campus, several faculty members will be using one room.
 - ▶ Please do not leave your instructional materials in the room. Tidy up after class and return desks to their original location.
 - ▶ AV should be functioning in all the rooms. If something is not working, please let us know and we will put in a work order.
 - ▶ Chris will be in Room 100 from 1-1:30pm today to demonstrate use of the new equipment.

- ▶ Mail room - mail is coming to BSSC soon. Please empty your box in the SOCS building by Sept. 12. Comms faculty will continue to receive mail in Fine Arts this Fall semester.
- ▶ Adjunct Offices in the new building have printers you can use.
- ▶ Unpacking - flatten your boxes and put them in the dumpster between BSSC and the Bookstore. Please be tidy and mindful that Facilities staff will be picking it all up.
- ▶ Last round of the move. Sept. 11th must be packed up, labeled, taped. On the morning of Sept. 12th the moving company will move the final items.
