Human Development 101

Orientation to College and Educational Planning

1 unit; 1 hour lecture

Recommended Preparation: Concurrent enrollment in English 1 or eligibility for English 1A or qualification by appropriate assessment or English as a Second Language 52B and English as a Second Language 53C Degree applicable Transfer CSU

This course provides students with the information, skills, and resources necessary for successful educational experiences. Students will become aware of their responsibilities as students in a diverse college setting, develop an understanding of their individual learning styles, create realistic and obtainable educational and career goals, develop skills in managing time to achieve goals, and learn how to create a support network using college resources and services.

Course Objectives:

- 1. Analyze the personal qualities and skills associated with success in a diverse college setting.
- 2. Examine individual learning styles and personality types and determine how they apply to student success in college.
- 3. Identify and implement the components of successful goal setting.
- 4. Assess and develop personal, educational, and professional goals.
- 5. Identify strategies for effective time management and develop a time management plan.
- 6. Evaluate the components necessary to create an individual educational plan.
- 7. Identify and access available resources and support services.
