I found it easier to suggest students use the 8th edition this fall as some of my students are joining me from different countries and/or are not local during covid (the 8th Ed. can be found online from multiple sources). That posed additional challenges for some with cost/shipping so rentals of the 8th edition of On Course became highly sought after this term in my sections."

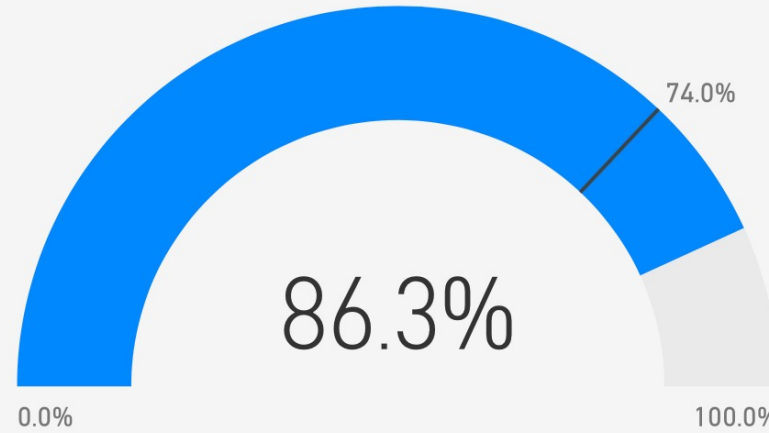

Success Rates Report Spring 2020 Success and Enrollments*

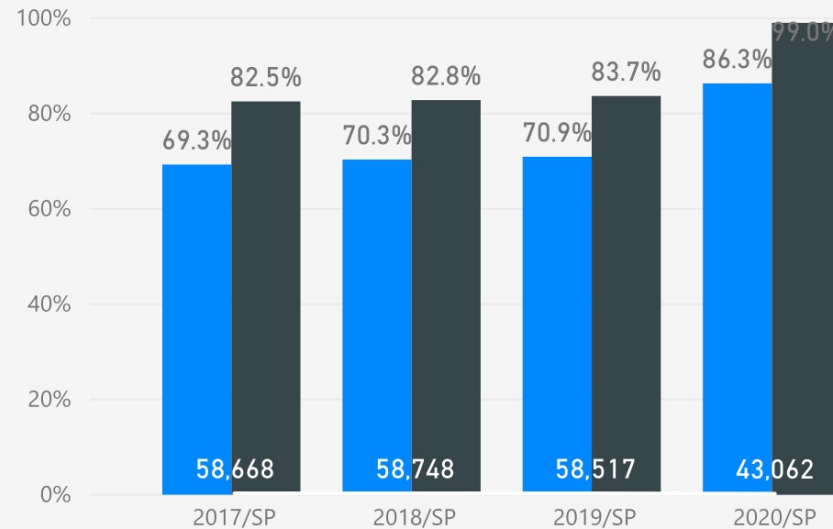

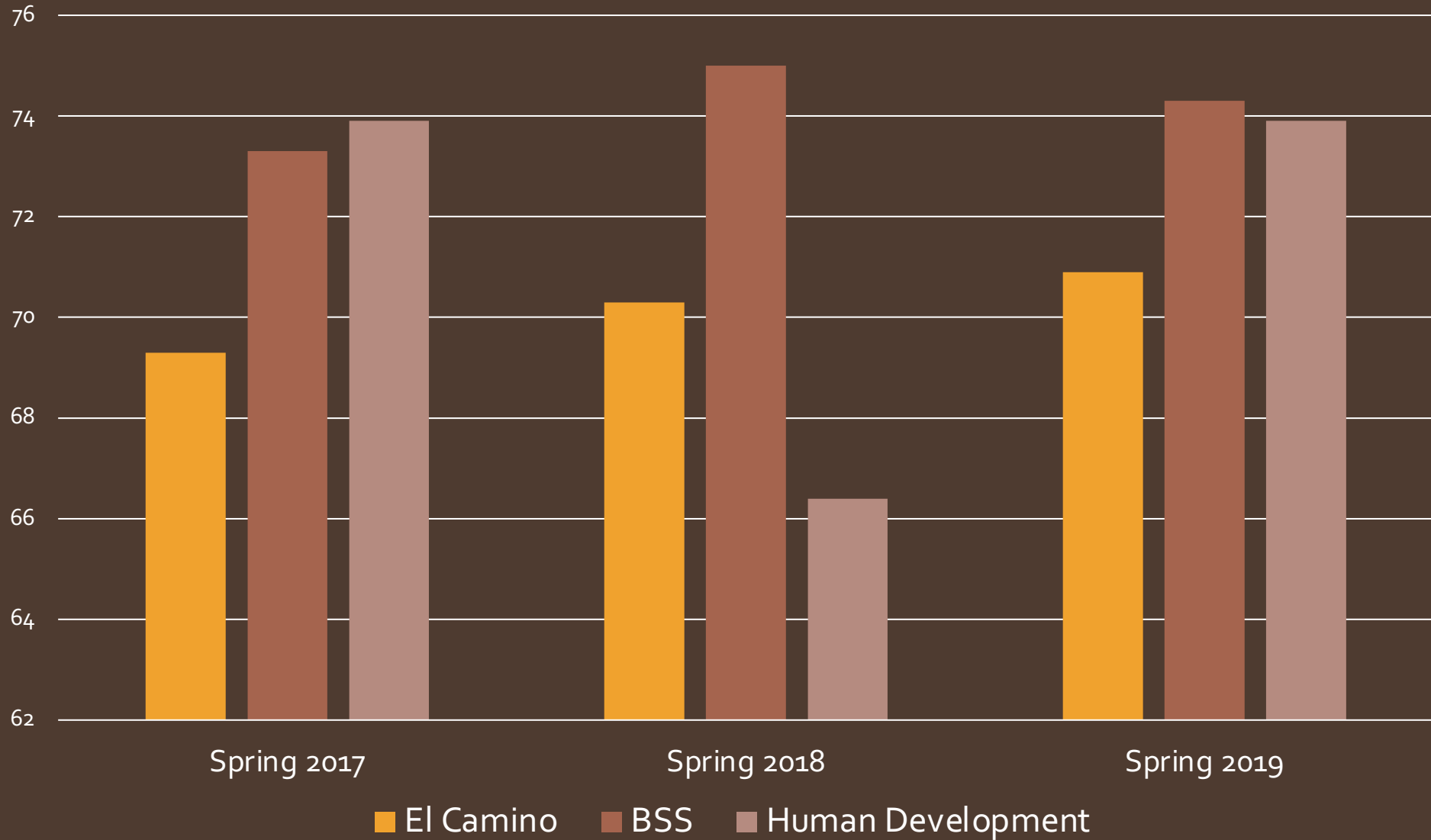


Four Year Success Trend

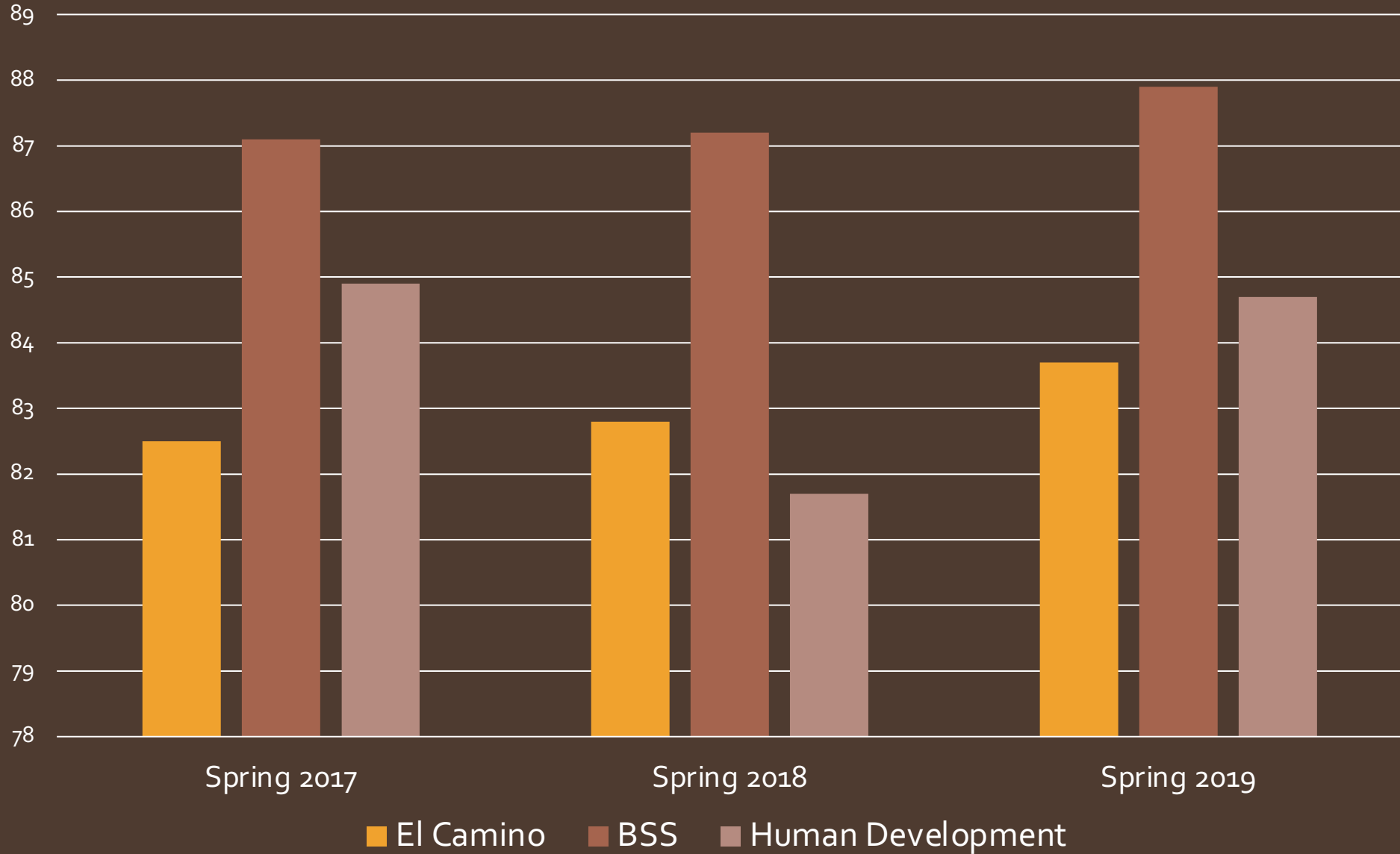
● Success Rate ● Course Completion Rate ●



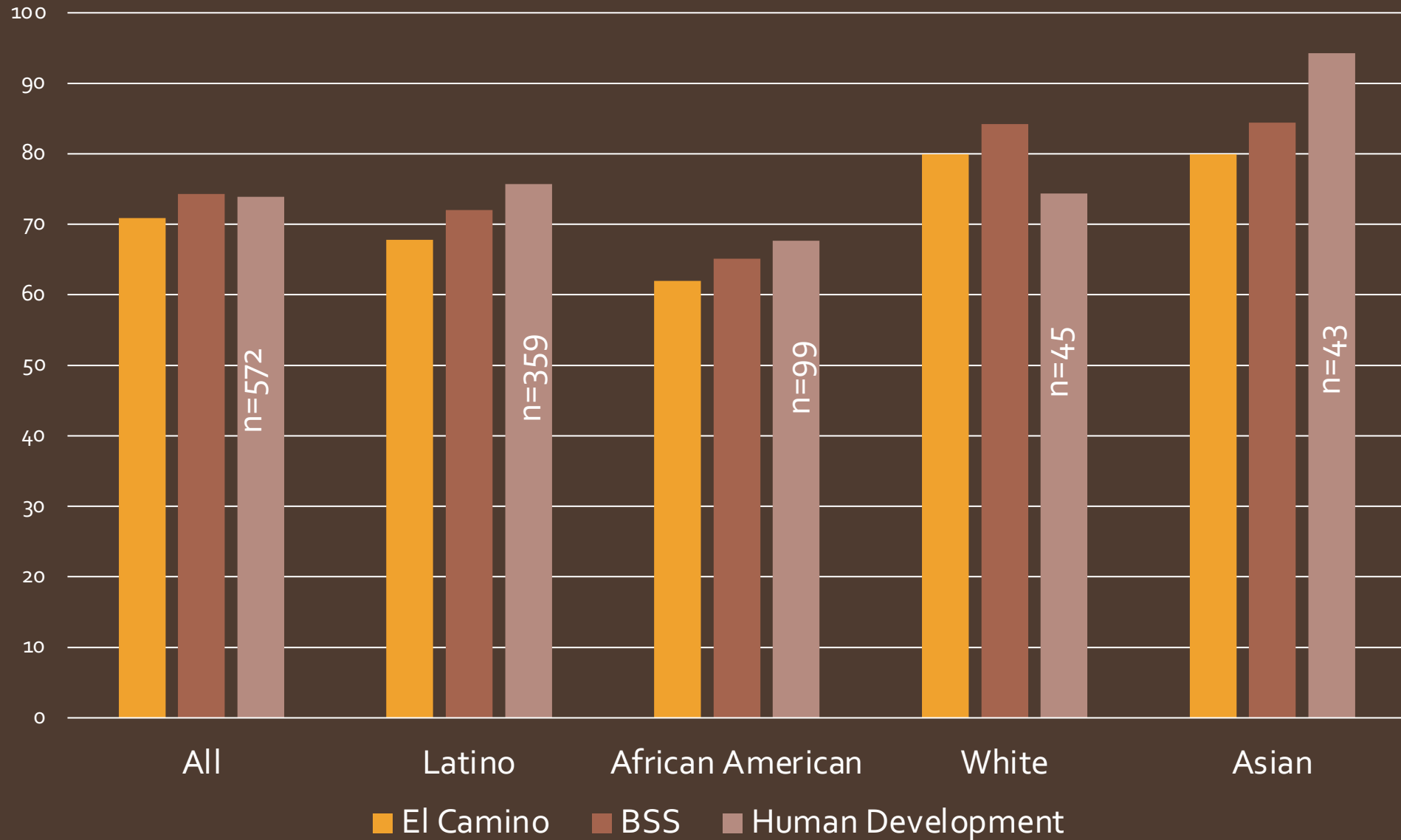
Success Rates (ECC, BSS, Human Development) – Spring 2017-19



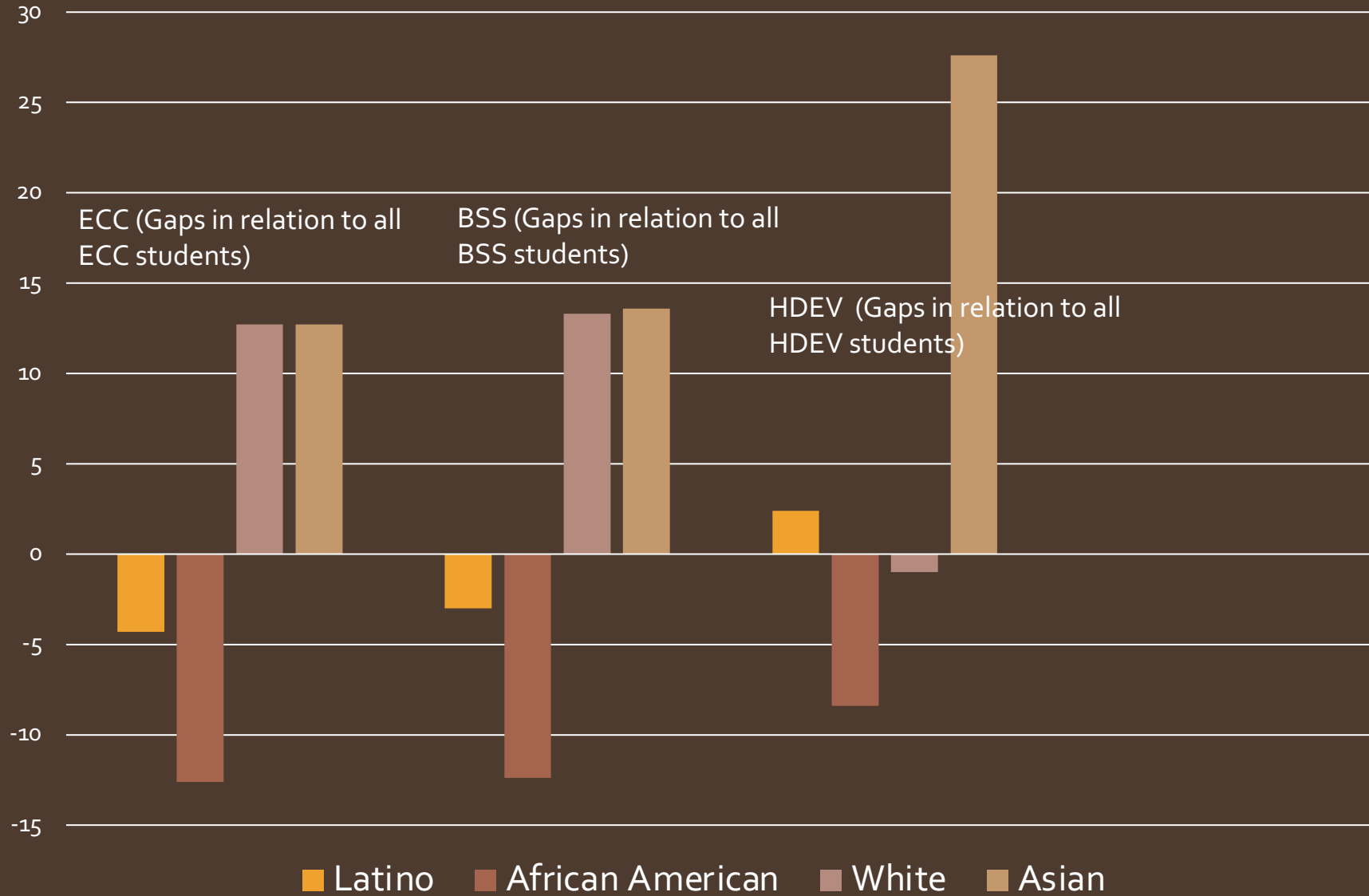
Retention (ECC, BSS, Human Development) – Spring 2017-19
