I) Psychology/Human Dev't Department

- Chris completed the Formstack for changes in programs, indicating that the Psychology and Human Development departments will be combined.
- The VPAA has approved the merger, and Chris will check where it is in the process.

II) SLOs – Spring 2024

- Psychology – needs to complete some of the Spring SLOs - 102 (Julio), 112 (Mary Stelter), 115 (Renee) and 125 (Amy) by Sept. 13 (See Amy's attached spread sheet)
- Human Development – completed Spring 2024 SLOs. For Fall, assessments include HDEV 101 #3, HDEV 110 #3, HDEV 110H #3, and LGBTQ+ Studies (Sarah).
- Keep an eye on your email for Nuventive trainings.

III) Requests for New Positions

- The Faculty Obligation Number will likely be around 297 (Please note the corrected number from what Chris said in the meeting). The current number of full-time faculty are well above that number at 339. This means that it is unlikely many full-time faculty positions will be selected for hiring this Fall. Nevertheless, if a department needs a full-time faculty member, they should still request one.
- Psychology is down from 8 to 4 faculty and will request 2 positions.
- Human Development is down from 4 to 1.5 faculty and will also request 2 positions.
- Chris will draft the requests and share them with the faculty.
- Here is the timeline for the faculty position identification process.
 - Thursday, September 19 – Ranked by Division Council
 - Friday, September 20 – Due to VPAA
 - Friday, October 18 – Ranking by Faculty Prioritization Committee
 - Before Thanksgiving – President announces finalized prioritized list
 - End Fall Semester – Work on job announcements

IV) On Campus Enrollment

- On-campus sections, especially Psychology 101, are very full across the division. There is some fraud striking online sections, and also some face-to-face sections.
- Next Winter and Spring, the number of on campus sections will be increased significantly as we move towards a 50% online / 50% on campus balance.
- A new block schedule will be used for Winter and Spring. There will be a very quick passing time in the Spring. This is intended to benefit students so that more classes can be scheduled in impacted programs and students will have fewer conflicts as they are selecting classes.

The psychology program is designed to provide students with a foundation in the science of psychology. Psychology majors will acquire the ability to survey theories critically, research the major areas of psychology, use descriptive and inferential statistics, design and conduct research, and write reports using analysis, argumentation, and proper psychological style. This major prepares students for career opportunities in fields such as teaching, research, and/or clinical practice. Competencies will be assessed regularly by evaluating student performance on exams, essays, and reports.

The Associate in Arts for Transfer (AA-T) is intended for students who plan to complete a bachelor's degree in a similar major at a CSU campus. Students completing the AA-T are given priority consideration for admission to the CSU system, but not to a particular campus or major. In order to earn an AA-T degree, students must complete:

1. Completion of 60 semester units that are eligible for transfer to the California State University.
2. The Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) or the California State University General Education - Breadth Requirements.
3. A minimum of 18 semester units in a major or area of emphasis, as determined by the community college district.
4. Obtainment of a minimum grade point average of 2.0.
5. A grade of "C" or better in all courses required for the major or area of emphasis.

Students who have completed the AA-T will have a strong academic foundation in the field and will be prepared for upper division baccalaureate study at the university. The coursework will satisfy most of the lower-division requirements at many institutions within the California State University system. Students transferring to a UC, private, or out-of-state university should consult with an El Camino College counselor when planning to complete the degree since transfer requirements may be slightly different than those required for the AA-T.
