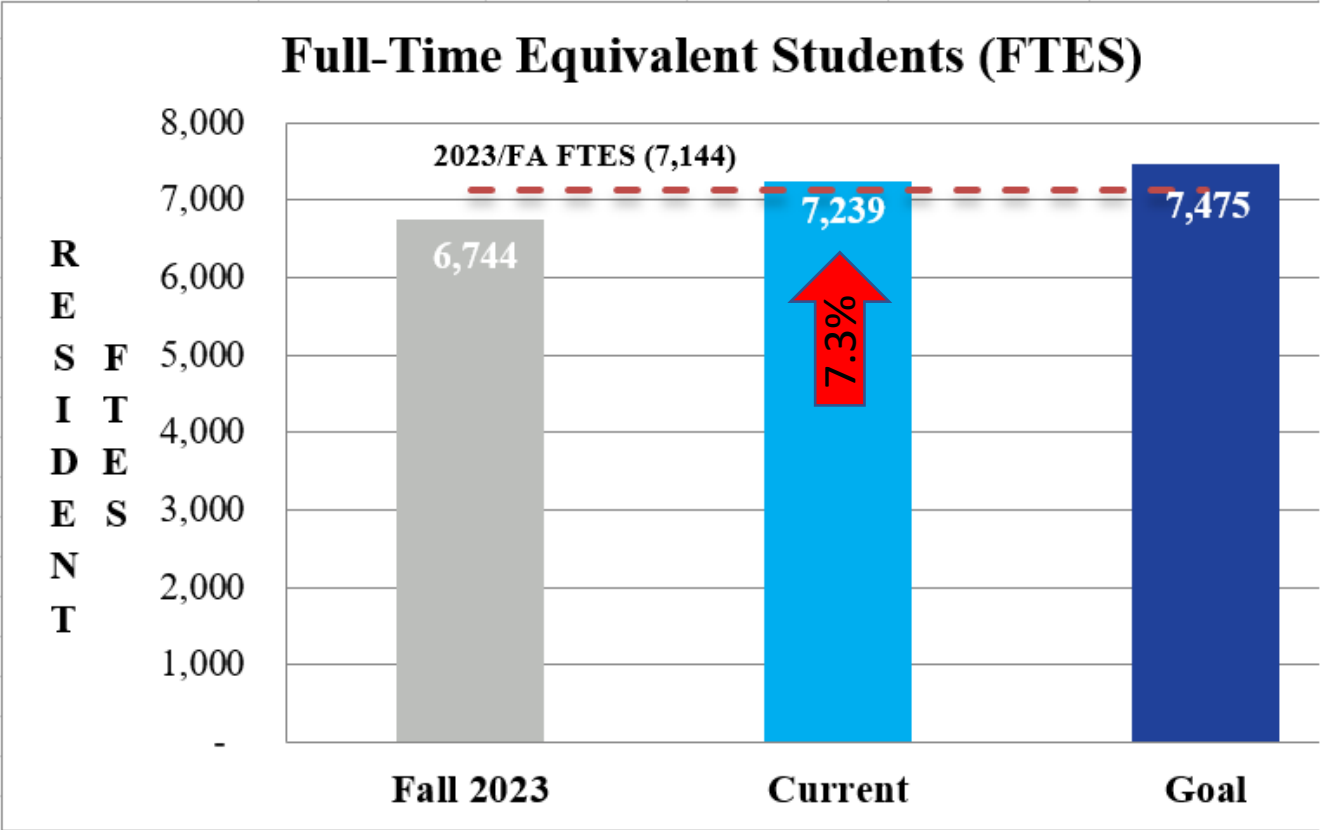

Enrollment across the College is currently up 7.3%. It will likely continue to increase as there is ongoing student demand. It is possible that there will be a larger than usual drop with No Shows as ongoing fraud is likely.



The district is currently earning 457 non-resident FTES in addition to the 7,239 resident FTES.

Enrollment

BSS enrollment is up 19.9% today, significantly higher than the College as a whole. Given BSS has proportionally more online courses than the College as a whole, it's possible we will experience more fraud.

Fraud and Adding Students

VPAA Carlos Lopez visited the meeting and reminded faculty although they file No Show reports, they don't need to become detectives and should place their energy on real students who are there to learn.

Please identify and drop fraudulent students as No Shows.

How? Log into MyECC. On the left, select Webadvisor for Faculty. Select No Show.

Why?

- Protects the college and all students from financial aid fraud (very costly)
- Opens up seats for real students (many BSS classes are full)

Please add students to fill open seats.

How? Follow the procedures in the handout at the back of the room

Why?

- Many classes are full and we don't want fraud to prevent legitimate students from making progress towards their degree.
- The College is working to increase revenues so we can limit the number of budget cuts. Filling up classes is a win-win.

Academic Freedom and Political Debate in the Classroom

In the Spring and Summer, the Dean saw an increase in student complaints about how content was presented in the classroom. She reminded faculty that as discipline experts in the field, they have academic freedom when presenting the content. Our campus also protects students' academic freedom "in learning," and there needs to be space in the classroom for diverse opinions. This does not mean hate speech or verbal attacks on individuals is permitted. Please speak with Dean Gold if this happens in your classroom or if you are concerned about a possible Title IX violation.

Board Policy 4030 Academic Freedom

The El Camino College District recognizes that institutions of higher education are conducted for the common good and not to further the interest of either the individual faculty member or the institution as a whole. The free search for truth and the expression of diverse opinions are essential to a democratic society. As such, academic freedom is essential to these purposes and applies to both teaching and research. Academic freedom is fundamental for the protection of the rights of the faculty member in teaching and of the student in learning. It carries with it responsibilities correlative with rights. Accordingly, a faculty member shall have the freedom:

1. To examine or endorse unpopular or controversial ideas either in classroom teaching or in discussions with students as is appropriate to the course content, or in academic research or publication, while recognizing the responsibilities to be accurate, objective and respectful of others. Faculty also have the responsibility to grade students solely on the basis of evidence of knowledge of the material pertinent to the class and attainment of appropriate skills, or other generally accepted grading criteria, avoiding any bias generated by a student's political outlook, religious belief or other personal attributes.
2. To select or recommend the selection of course instructional materials that may contain unpopular or controversial ideas, with the correlative responsibility that these materials are pertinent for the course.
3. To speak or write as an individual member of society, provided that the faculty member recognizes the special professional obligations of an educator to be accurate, objective and respectful of others, and that the faculty member take care to avoid leaving the impression that he or she is speaking for the college or the district.
4. To select or recommend library books, materials, media and online resources representing a multiplicity of philosophies and points of view and an awareness of the diverse perspectives and lived experiences of students, relying on professional expertise to maintain appropriate depth and breadth of the collections.

A faculty member shall not be subject to any adverse action affecting their employment with the El Camino College District for exercising any of the foregoing choices.

Procedures for implementing the policy will be developed in collegial consultation with the Academic Senate.

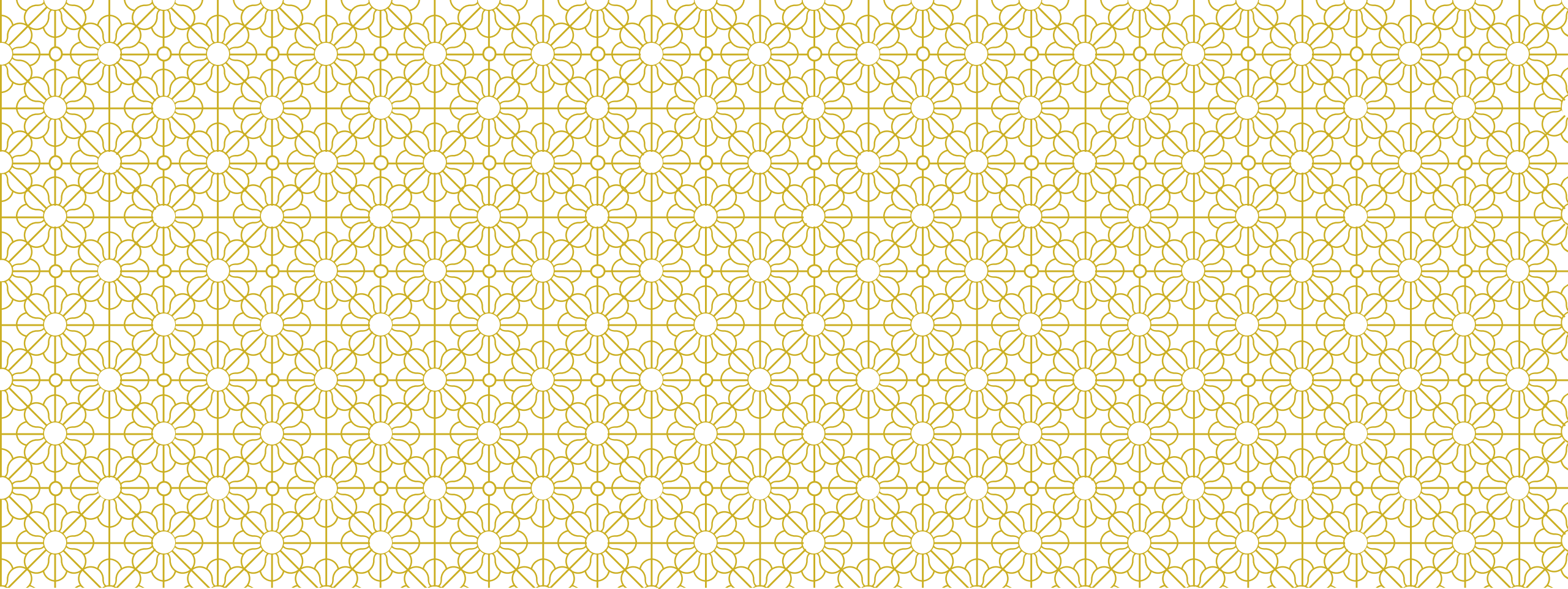
Student Misbehavior

Ricky answered many questions about how to handle AI and fraud. He explained the process by which fraudulent students are removed. The handout “AI and Fraudulent Students in Asynchronous Online Classes: Guidance and Procedure” was shared with faculty.

1. When should a faculty member file an Incident Report and Referral Form? What sorts of behavior would trigger this?
2. What sorts of student behavior would warrant a two-day suspension by a faculty member? What are the terms of suspension and how is it enforced?
3. What sorts of student behavior would lead a faculty member to call the police? What does it typically look like when campus police handles student misbehavior in or outside the classroom?
