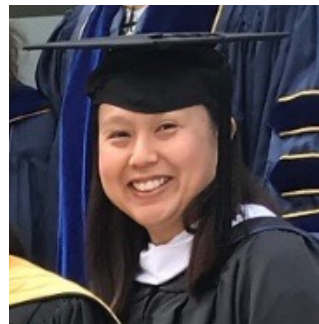

## Coronavirus Update

The World Health Organization and the Centers for Disease Control have both declared the coronavirus outbreak in China a public health emergency. Accordingly, El Camino College is providing direction to all students, including those who may have recently returned from China.

Guided by Los Angeles County Department of Public Health protocols, we are relaying information to those who may have recently visited China, as well as measures for preventing infection, awareness of potential symptoms, and instructions for receiving medical care. To date, there are no known cases of coronavirus at El Camino College.

Although the coronavirus situation is rapidly evolving, officials indicate there is no cause for alarm. L.A. County's Public Health Department says "residents, students, workers, and visitors should continue to engage in their regular activities and practice good public health hygiene." According to the CDC, good hygiene practices include:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds, especially after going to the bathroom; before eating; and after blowing your nose, coughing, or sneezing.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol. Always wash hands with soap and water if hands are visibly dirty.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth with unwashed hands.
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick.
- Stay home when you are sick.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces using a regular household cleaning spray or wipe.

If you or someone you know has recently traveled to China and feel sick, seek medical care right away. Before you go to a doctor's office or emergency room, call ahead and tell them about your recent travel and your symptoms.

# NOVEL CORONAVIRUS

## What You Need to Know

The virus is NOT currently spreading in the community in Los Angeles County nor in the United States. The immediate risk to the general public in Los Angeles County is low. Public Health is carefully assessing this situation as it evolves.

## How is it spread?



Through droplets when an infected person coughs or sneezes



Close personal contact, such as caring for an infected person

The novel coronavirus is a new type of virus that recently started making people sick. It started in mainland China but is now also infecting people in other countries. Current knowledge is largely based on what is known about similar coronaviruses. As it is a new virus, we are learning more each day.

## What are the symptoms?



Fever



Cough



Difficulty Breathing



Severe Illness

## What can I do to protect myself and others from respiratory infections like novel coronavirus?

- Stay home when you are sick.
- Limit close contact with people who are sick.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds.
- If soap and water are not readily available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer.
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth.
- Cover your cough or sneeze with a tissue, then throw the tissue in the trash. If you do not have a tissue, use your sleeve (not your hands).
- Facemasks are most effective when used by people who are sick.

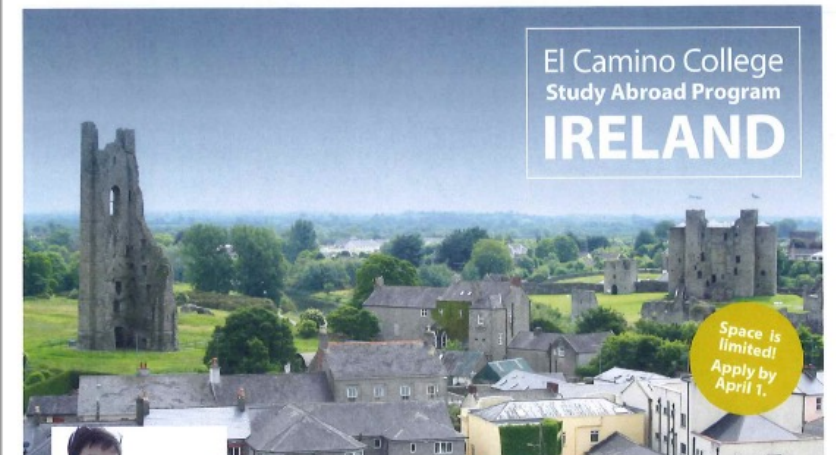

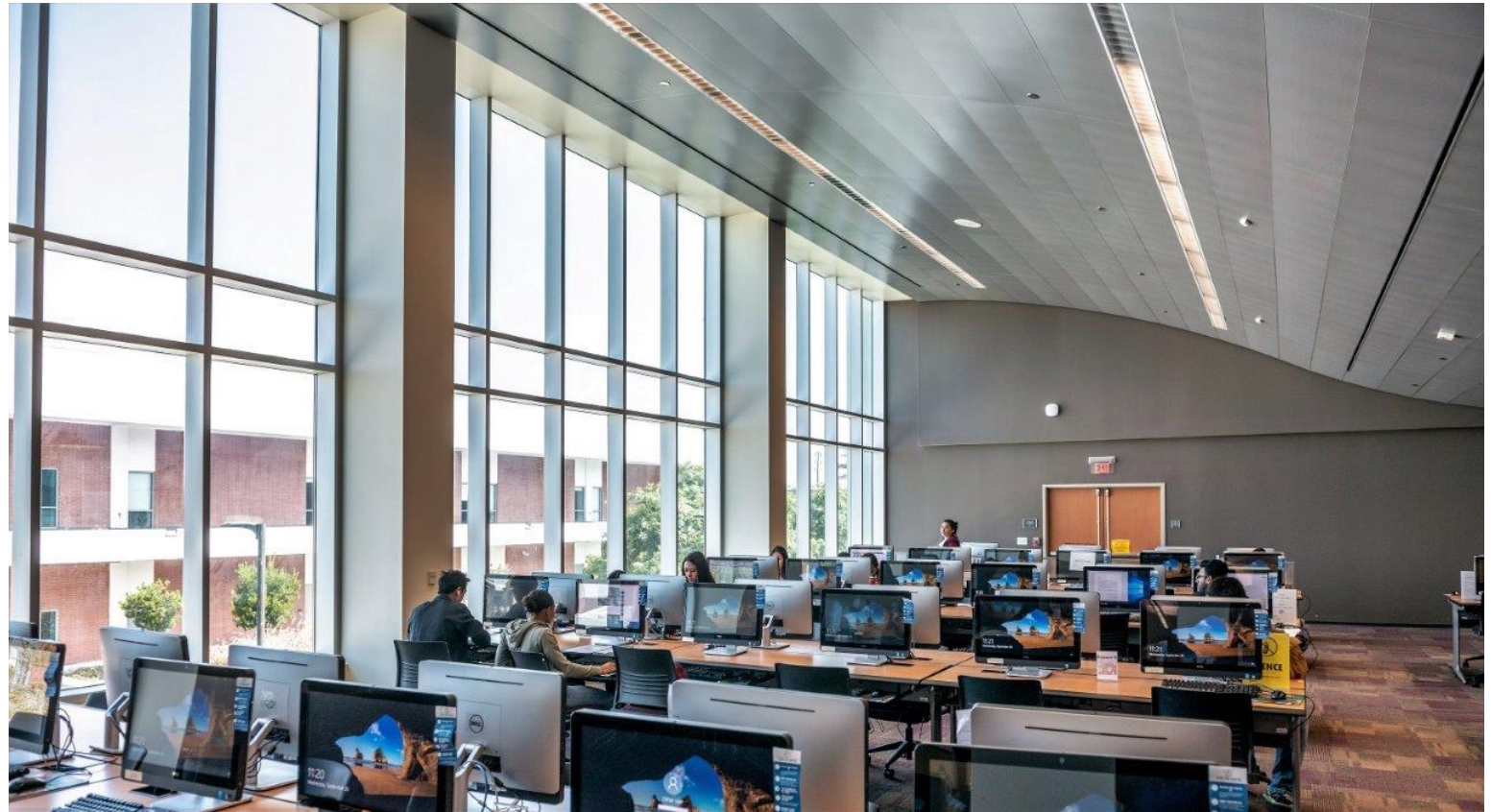
