Report from the Data Committee

Chris Gold gave a brief report on the work of the data committee. She pointed out that we have a higher proportion of African American and Latino students earning General Studies degrees, and that it might be interesting to try and unravel why that is. Are they being funneled into that degree by counselors? Are they taking that degree in addition to a degree in another major?


Orion Teal suggested that we might want to look at "time to degree" measures to see if students who have accumulated a lot of credits over a lot of years are opting for General Studies degrees rather than more specialized majors.

Chris Gold brought up a study from several years ago (2017?) that IR did on "time to degree," and suggested that we might put in a request for them to produce an updated study.

Report from the OER/ZTC Committee

Mary McMillan gave an update on the work of the OER Advisory Committee, and reported that they are interested in producing a survey for both faculty and students to assess their experiences with OER/ZTC materials from a qualitative perspective. They plan on rolling that out near the latter half of the semester.

In addition, Mary and the OER/ZTC committee will be working on an audit to identify any potential "roadblocks" to an OER/ZTC degree pathway in History. Developing a history pathway will likely be a multi-year process, but it would also be a first (not just for our campus, but state wide), so we'll take our time and be methodical.
