## California Community Colleges Zero Textbook Cost Program Grants

Mary McMillan presented an update on the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges' grants for planning and implementing zero textbook cost (ZTC) pathways to degrees. Most important for this is the new reporting requirements put forth by the state, which will hopefully ensure that we can gather more accurate and complete information on which materials are being used in our courses. This is necessary to prove that we actually have ZTC pathways, and to ensure that we keep them open. Crystal Martin is currently working on the reporting forms for this.

In Phase 1, each college will get \$20k for planning for ZTC development or implementation. In Phase 2, colleges can apply for up to \$200k per ZTC program implemented. This will be a competitive grant process, and the application is due by the end of the Fall semester. In the newly announced Phase 3, each college will receive up to \$180k to develop a work plan for ZTC program. The upshot is that El Camino College will likely receive close to \$200k for developing and implementing ZTC pathways, and could receive more as part of the Phase 2 grant. As a condition for Phase 2 and 2 funding, we need:

- We need to be reporting the cost of each course (including textbook costs) to in the course listings
- To ensure accurate reporting (see previous paragraph)
- Ensure all OER materials are ADA compliant
- Ensure all OER materials are copyright compliant
- Prioritize classes with large enrollments
- Prioritize creating new pathways rather than copying existing pathways at other colleges
- Must share pathways/plans with all California Community Colleges and the California Open Library

Using this <u>list</u>, Mary has identified several potential degree pathways within BSS that might be eligible for funding (see table below).
