I. College/Division Updates

- a. Facility Updates- Softball building updates discussed.
- b. Full-Time Faculty Prioritization
 - B. President B Thames selected several programs. Adaptive Physical Education (APE) was prioritized, with a full-time APE position expected to be filled soon.
 - C. The president indicated that once the semester concludes and positive attendance rosters are confirmed, there is a strong possibility of adding new positions.
 Athletics/KIN may be next. After discussions with VP C Lopez, there is a possibility of adding 4–5 new positions, though the current standing is unclear.
 - D. A Francisco and J Baumunk are working on a 50% faculty position combined with 50% release time for paperwork, scheduling, recruitment, and related duties for coaches.

II. Curriculum News

- a. PE 40 (In-Season Flag Football)- Student Learning Outcomes (SLOs) need to be rewritten with measurable outcomes.
- b. PE 64 (Flag Football Activity Class)- Critical assignments need to be reworked and reflect more like the Football Critical Assignments Curriculum. Once revised, the course should be approved. J Hall will continue overseeing this process (including PE 40).

III. Load Committee Updates

- a. Most requests were denied.
- b. VP C Lopez repeatedly cited section caps, referencing factors such as room size and equipment availability.



c. The VP delegated authority to Deans to determine section caps, provided there is no manipulation of programs solely to assign workload.

IV. Lab Parity Concerns

- a. Dance was approved, while Kinesiology was denied, despite similarities.
- b. Ongoing concern regarding repeated denials.
- c. G Lindheim noted extensive documentation (over 60 pages) and preparation hours submitted for lab parity, which have been systematically rejected.
- d. There is a strong concern that the work is being marginalized and treated as equivalent to non-collegiate PE (e.g., YMCA-level activity).
- e. Over 40 lab parity applications have been submitted.
- f. J Baumunk requested to join the Lab Parity Committee to understand the process better but was denied.
- g. T Hazell questioned whether this denial violates contractual rotation requirements for deans.

V. Area Reports and Announcements (other reps not present; no reports)

- a. Academic Senate
 - o Ongoing debate regarding placement of Math and English in first-semester mapping.
 - o The 3-year and 10-year Strategic Plans are now available for the college.
 - o The Academic Integrity Handbook has been released.
 - o Sabbatical leave remains an unresolved issue.
