# Dual Enrollment – Updates

## Students Apply Once!

K-12 students apply only once. As long as student does not miss consecutive primary terms, i.e. Fall and Spring, a student does not need to re-apply for admission each term.

## What is dual/concurrent enrollment

These two terms are often used interchangeably.

Dual and concurrent enrollment offer high school students access to college level coursework. In some cases\*, students earn both high school and college credit depending on approval from local school and community college governing boards.

\*some high schools have a pre-approval form or process and may/may not grant high school credit for their college class(es). Each high school is different. Please make sure the student and the parents know this.

## Why Dual Enrollment?

Dual enrollment is an effective strategy that leverages partnerships between high school and community college to create seamless pathways from high school to college.

### **Dual enrollment has three key benefits:**

1. Reduction of time to degree completion.
2. Increasing college attainment.
3. Closing achievement gaps for underrepresented students.

Students who participate in dual enrollment at a community college during high school are more likely to graduate and enter college and more likely to complete a certificate, degree, or transfer. A key finding was that students most underrepresented in community colleges often benefit the most.

# Planning for Winter/Spring Dual Enrollment

- Winter/Spring 2022 Term – Online and In Person (75%)
  - Apply for Admission now for Winter/Spring 2022.
  - Registration for Winter/Spring begins around mid-end of November 2021 for high school dual enrolled students. Registration assistance sessions is provided.
  - Submit your dual enrollment form.
    - Winter: Limited to ONE class.
    - Spring: Limited to two classes or up to 11 units; must receive permission from our Registrar for more than two classes.

# Dual Enrollment K-14 Career Pathways

Sequence of dual enrollment classes that lead to a college certificate in a high demand, high wage career.

- 11<sup>th</sup> & 12<sup>th</sup> grade
- 2-year program commitment
- Aligned to a certificate, degree and/or transfer to a university

# Dual Enrollment Process By Grade Level

Steps to enrollment include:

- 9<sup>th</sup> and 10<sup>th</sup> grade students
  - Apply for admission
  - Complete a Dual Enrollment Application each term
    - ***Must obtain Dean's approval***
    - ***Submit high school transcripts***
    - *The college reserves the right to limit enrollment*
  - Clear any prerequisites
  - Student should lead the process
- 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students
  - Apply for admission
  - Complete a Dual Enrollment Application each term
  - Few course restrictions: Pre-COVID PE contact classes, life drawing
  - Clear any prerequisites
    - English & Math Placement Survey
    - Submit any AP Test Scores
  - Student should lead the process



# Dual Enrollment - 2 Types

## Dual Enrollment at El Camino College – First Type

- 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> grade students:
  - Apply for admission
  - Complete a Dual Enrollment Application each term
    - **Must obtain Dean's approval**
    - **Submit high school transcripts**
    - *The college reserves the right to limit enrollment*
  - Clear any prerequisites
  - Student registers for class(es) – on their own (but not alone).
  - Class(es) are usually afternoon, evening, weekend, or online and with adult college students.
  - Request transcripts – submit to their high school.
- 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students
  - Apply for admission

# Dual Enrollment - 2 Types

## Dual Enrollment at Your High School – Second Type

- 9<sup>th</sup> & 10<sup>th</sup> grade students:
  - Apply for admission
  - Complete a Dual Enrollment Application each term
    - **Must obtain Dean's approval**
    - **Submit high school transcripts**
    - *The college reserves the right to limit enrollment*
  - Clear any prerequisites
  - Students are manually registered by A&R.
  - Class(es) are usually 'zero' period, core day, afternoon, or online with their peers.
  - Grades provided to the high school – added to transcript.
- 11<sup>th</sup> and 12<sup>th</sup> grade students
  - Apply for admission
  - Complete a Dual Enrollment Application each term
  - Few course restrictions: PE contact courses, life drawing, etc.
  - Clear any prerequisites
    - English & Math Placement Survey
    - Submit any AP Test Scores
  - Students are manually registered by A&R.
  - Class(es) are usually 'zero' period, core day, afternoon, or online with their peers.
  - Grades provided to the high school – added to transcript.



# What courses can I take?

- Dual enrollment is an opportunity to save time, save money, explore an interest, fulfill a high school requirement – all at the same time!
- Before you register, please make sure students have the appropriate permission i.e. pre-approval form/process and submit a completed dual enrollment form.
- A list of our most popular and recommended courses is available on the El Camino College Dual Enrollment webpage.
- This list is divided by grade level: 9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> grade and 11<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grade.
- El Camino College, like most community colleges, reserves the right to limit the courses a 9<sup>th</sup>-10<sup>th</sup> grade student may take. For more about this, please review the Course Restrictions webpage.
- Upon completion of classes, submit a Transcript showing grades earned to your high school so that you receive credit.

## FERPA and what is it?

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) is a Federal law that gives parents certain rights with respect to their children's education records.

When a student turns 18 years old or enters a post-secondary institution at any age, all rights afforded to parents under FERPA transfer to the student.

For this reason, El Camino College can only provide information pertaining to a K-12/dual enrolled student's application, registration, etc., directly to the student regardless of age.

# Dual Enrollment Summary

- Dual enrollment is an equity program, it's a chance to save time, save money, explore interests and more.
- Students apply for admission once, new ESTU 1, 3, 5 classes for 10<sup>th</sup> grade students, Ethnic Studies HS graduation requirement beginning 2025, K14 Career Pathways and more.
- There are two types of dual enrollment: at the college and at your high school. Students may do both.
- Students must submit a Dual Enrollment Form each term.
- Applying for dual enrollment is applying to college; these are college courses, and the beginning of your students' college transcript.
- Students with a disability, undocumented students, and international students can do dual enrollment! (*International students (F-1 and F-2) may be eligible*).
- Dual Enrollment can save students and their families hundreds if not thousands of dollars!
- Students: **YOU CAN DO IT!!! WE'RE HERE TO HELP!!!**
