COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed for the student who wishes to prepare for entry level position as a firefighter and become certify as a Fire Fighter I as specified by the California State Fire Marshal's Office. The student will participate in a 400-hours course of instruction emphasizing basic firefighting skills. Recruits will be issue 15 State Fire Marshal certification, NWCG- S-130, S-190, El Camino College Fire Academy Certification.

All fees for the State Fire Training Certificates will be collected on: Full-Time on the 8th week, Part-Time on the 14th week. Check Made to: El Camino College Fire Academy.

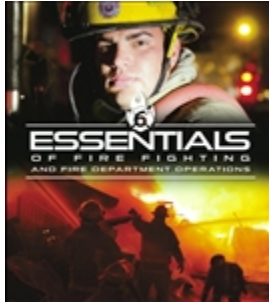
