

#### HELPFUL TIPS

Go to google.com or yahoo.com and search for child development scholarships in California. Just make sure you never pay for a service. There are a lot of scams out there. They may say for a \$40 fee, that site will guarantee you a scholarship and then the student will receive a \$25 scholarship. No reputable scholarship Web site will ask for a fee. Promises of “free money” or a guaranteed “win” are warning signs. If it sounds too good to be true, it probably is!
