The authority to oversee the admissions of eligible students is delegated to the Registrar.

## **Eligibility for Admissions**

Any high school graduate or individual with a General Equivalency Development (GED) credential or California High School Proficiency Examination (CHSPE) certificate may be admitted.

The Dean of Enrollment Services shall be responsible for evaluating the validity of a student's high school completion if the college or the United States Department of Education has reason to believe that the high school diploma is not valid or was not obtained from an entity that provides secondary school education.

## Non-High School Graduates Over Age 18

Any person who is over the age of 18 years and who, in the judgment of the Dean of Enrollment Services or his/her designee, is capable of benefiting from instruction offered may be admitted to El Camino College. Such persons shall be required to comply with the District's rules and regulations regarding scholastic achievement along with other standards to be met by provisional or probationary students as a condition to being readmitted in any succeeding semester. Non-high school graduates are highly encouraged to utilize counseling services.

Admissions Procedures for Non-Resident Students that Include a Determination of Residency Refer to ECC Administrative Procedure 5015.
