Congratulations! This is the last Board meeting prior to academic final exams. I trust you will join our students in preparing for final exams and Commencement prior to the June Board meeting.

While this Board agenda is fairly routine, I would like to draw some issues to your attention.

- 1. We will have two brief presentations. One recognizing the first-place awardees in a computer programming contest at California State University, Los Angeles and, at Board President Jackson's request, meeting the El Camino College Forensics Team.
- 2. Academic Affairs and Student and Community Advancement provide routine transactions. Please note the significant grant activity in Student and Community Advancement.
- 3. Administrative Services is highlighted by the enclosed 2009-2010 Tentative Budget. As you are aware the world, national and state fiscal conditions are troubling. Nevertheless, El Camino College presents a first reading of a very tentative, appropriately named, budget for 2009-2010 which will be recommended for your next meeting on June 15, 2009.
- 4. Measure E, Bond fund, includes a number of routine contract approvals and change orders. We are excited to note that our parking structure will be open for Commencement and for a Trustee visit at the June 15<sup>th</sup> Board meeting.
- 5. Human Resources includes a number of routine personnel actions.
- The Superintendent/President's section presents the first reading of amendments to Board Policy 2715. The updates are required to comply with Accreditation Standards.
- 7. Under Other Items, Trustee Gen proposes that the Board adopt a Resolution in support of Propositions 1A through 1F on the May 19, 2009, statewide ballot.

8. Closed Session includes a relatively brief personnel matter.

Enclosed is a revised calendar of end-of-year activities. Again, we encourage you to attend any and all events. If you would be so kind to let Kathy Oswald know of your participation, we will be sure to recognize you. This is a wonderful time of year and I trust you enjoy the joy our community shares throughout all these recognitions.

#### Brown Act

California Government Code Sections 54950 – 54963 encompasses the Brown Act which governs all meetings of a legislative body of a local agency. While most of the board's business must be held in an open meeting that allows the public to comment, Government Code Sections 54956 and 54957 outline the criteria for what business can be conducted in closed session. This includes but is not limited to:

- 1. Pending litigation the ability to confer with or receive advice from legal counsel
- 2. Personnel matters complaints or charges against employees, performance evaluations, compensation/salary setting, matters involving probationary or specific employees not involving complaints
- 3. Labor Negotiations/relations
- 4. Real Property Transactions
- 5. Student Discipline
- 6. Security Threats/Public Safety Reasons
- 7. Reviewing license applications of an individual with a criminal record

After the Board meeting, a Board member indicated to Mrs. Higdon that an elected official had reported to her that:: (1) the College was telling the Roadium that we didn't want to accommodate them any more, and (2) that the Roadium was considering moving its entire operations elsewhere. Mrs. Higdon responded that the meetings with the designated representative of the Roadium were on-going and collegial. The Trustee inquired whether we would be getting a higher fee from the Roadium. Mrs. Higdon replied that the Roadium had been requested to sharpen their pencil at every negotiating session.
