Dear Members of the Board:

Welcome to the August 18 Board packet. This Monday's agenda is the first activity of an exciting week which includes new faculty welcome activities, professional development day, and Saturday's official start of classes. As you know, we can guarantee parking spaces for this Board meeting. Come the following Monday, we hope to be inundated with students.

The agenda is initiated by a presentation of the El Camino Community College District budget, as noted on Attachment A. The General Fund general purpose budget will probably be handed to you as you enter the Board meeting as staff is busy making the final close to the accounting records for the 2013-14 fiscal year.

Consent agenda items include the following:

- 1. Student and Community Advancement (SCA), item E, recommends acceptance of a grant application for the Clean Energy Workforce Program (Attachment B). SCA, items C and D, are a First Reading of the Student Activities Fee. I believe both El Camino College and the Compton Center student organizations support this issue at this time. SCA, item G, recommends a student expulsion with details in a sealed envelope in your packet. If the Board has any questions, comments or concerns about this, it would be appropriate to recess to Closed Session for discussion.
- 2. Administrative Services (AS), item B, recommends the District continue its participation in the Chancellor's Office Tax Offset Program (COTOP), (Attachment C). AS, item C (Contracts Under \$84,100), includes recommendations to contract for international information tours and programs offered by El Camino College (Attachment D). AS, item H, is a Change Order for the sales/use tax on LED lighting that was installed under Prop 39 fund guidelines (Attachment E). AS, Item I, informs the public that El Camino College intends to enter into energy service contracts for energy conservation and is supplemented by Attachment F.

As requested, following is additional information regarding the Prop 39 grant:

<u>Grant Background</u>: The Prop 39 Clean Energy Workforce Program Improvement funds are based on the Chancellor's Prop 39: Clean Energy Jobs Act of 2012 to meet the requirements of SB 73.

Objective:

To reduce energy consumption in commercial, institutional, and industrial buildings through improved curriculum at community colleges regionally and by providing professional develop opportunities for instructors to upgrade their knowledge base.

Expected Outcome:

The grant focuses on Environmental Technology, Heating and Air Conditioning (HVAC), Construction, and possibly Electronics programs.

- 1) Faculty will attend professional development and training related to their disciplines and related areas.
- 2) Create possible inter-disciplinary certificates.
- 3) Update curriculum as needed to reflect industry needs.
- 4) Purchase new equipment.
- 5) Develop long-lasting, sustainable, and environmentally conscientious practices.
- 6) Funding is based on last year's program completers and for 2014-15 completers.

The Measure E agenda contains a change order in the amount of \$34,204 for the sales/use tax on LED lighting that was installed under Prop 39 fund guidelines. For the purchase of the LED lights, we used the State approved process of CMAS. However, the sales/use tax for those lights was inadvertently left off the vendor form. Thus, change order H on page AS 8 is required in order for the County to pay the vendor (Graybar) the correct amount. Staff has verified all of the financial charges with the CMAS bid process.

Subject:

Proposition 39 Projects

ECC has an opportunity to use State Prop 39 funds to accomplish a change out of the air handlers in the Science Building. These air handler units are not an off-the-shelf product. They take several months to custom build. Also, the time between Fall and Spring semesters is our only window for the accomplishment of this task. To add more restrictions for the Prop 39 funding, nothing can begin until the State gives us the green light, and it all must be completed and paid by May 2015. These types of challenges are common in any energy savings retrofit project funded by the State. Thus, in the workshops on Prop 39, we have all been encouraged to use these provisions provided by the State of California (referred to as Government Code Section 4217) to accomplish such projects. In addition, due to our academic schedule window to accomplish a change out of our air handler in the PE Building, we have the same time challenges on that project as well.

Based upon the above restrictions, I recommend we use the Government Code Section 4217 process on both HVAC projects. I see no other way to accomplish such daunting tasks. The process begins with the Notice of Publication of Intent that appears as item I (page AS 8) in our August Board Agenda. In collaboration with SCE and its consultants, approximately three substantive vendors will be requested to provide sealed quotes. Those will be reviewed using established rating criteria and a vendor selection recommended. In addition to the preliminary notice that we intend to use this method of selection (which is part of the August Board Agenda), the award is then advertised and a "hearing" occurs at our September Board meeting. These award amounts will be in the hundreds of thousands of dollars.

Since this is not our standard bid practice, I wanted to make certain all parties were aware of the legal requirements that will be respected and followed. The Board action, along with the published notification, has been reviewed by our construction attorney and meets the provisions of Government Code Section 4217.

Recommendation





SUBJECT:

Puente Program

It is my recommendation that the Puente Program be suspended during the 2014-15 academic year to review and develop a plan to strengthen the program. Currently, one English instructor is available to teach in the Puente Program. However, due to personal responsibilities, she will be on a reduced load this year and unable to continue as the English coordinator in the program. In order for instructors to become Puente eligible, they must complete the training prescribed by the University of California Puente Program. With Rachel Ketai, English Instructor, unable to teach and no currently trained counselor in the Puente Program, the time is right for the college to suspend the program and develop a plan for addressing these types of personnel issues in the future. A viable program should not have to depend on one or two persons for continuation and institutionalization.

I discussed this recommendation with Tom Lew, Dean of Humanities, and he also recommends suspending the program for one year. The 25 students currently enrolled in the program will be converted to a First Year Experience Learning Community and through this, will not include the Puente student conference and other related activities to Puente, the FYE program is an enrichment program designed for new students. The First Year Experience program is a successful model used widely at the college. I have attached a memo from Tom Lew that provides specific details to support this recommendation.

Subject:

STEM

Per a Board Member's request, the following information on the STEM project is provided:

The STEM Project was identified in fall of 2010 as a high priority for the College. The capital funding and program enhancement of this project became a joint venture between the College and the Foundation. In the early stages of this capital project, our estimated cost to complete was \$2.7 million. However, as the project scope was further developed and the budget adjusted to match the expanded scope, the budget was refined to \$3.3 million. The final cost of the project was \$3.4 million due to change orders.

Funds for the capital budget are tracked and appear on documents as part of our Science Complex Renovation (STEM is in the basement of Natural Science). A breakdown of the capital expenses is attached. The Foundation also raised approximately \$250,000 for STEM enhancement programs which include our summer STEM institutes and our students attending various summer programs at nearby four-year colleges.

El Camino College was part of a consortium of colleges, unified school districts and Workforce Investment Boards (WIBS) that successfully competed for the Advanced Manufacturing and Engineering Technology Linked Learning Consortium (AMETLLC) grant. This consortium was quite large and included five community colleges, fifteen K12 districts, three WIBS or other intermediaries, numerous industries, as well as a number of technical support agencies. Long Beach City College is the fiscal agent for the nearly \$15 million dollar Career Pathways Trust grant funded by the California Department of Education


Although Inglewood Unified School District (IUSD) was asked to be a part of the AMETLLC Career Pathways Trust grant, they declined our invitation. Because there were different funding categories with different dollar amounts and partnership requirements, IUSD made the strategic decision to apply for a \$600,000 grant in a single district category instead of being a small part of a large consortium. Their proposal was also awarded.

El Camino College's department of Career Pathways is partnering with IUSD on their grant and offering assistance with articulation and concurrent enrollment support. Because both grants featured Engineering Technology and the pathways offered in this area at El Camino College, IUSD could only be a part of one of these opportunities. We are pleased they were awarded \$600,000 and look forward to working with IUSD.

Courses Offered at the High School

El Camino College offers two types of revenue generating courses at the local high schools. Contract education courses require the high schools to pay a fee for a course and these types of courses do not generate apportionment nor are subject to open enrollment regulations. The other type of revenue is from state funded apportionment courses. These courses must be open to the general public and published in the class schedule or the schedule database. Because some high schools are closed campuses, they prefer to offer contract education courses. This year, the college is offering eight contract courses at City Honors High School in Inglewood, four in the fall and four in the spring.
