Compton Parking Permits

Compton College parking permits will be honored at our campus only during the summer and vice versa for El Camino parking permits at Compton College. This applies to students, staff and faculty. Marketing should be sending out the information soon notifying the campus that effective in the fall semester, the permit reciprocity will not be honored.

Semester Parking Permits & Temporary Permits

Gary had gone to a Student Services combined division meeting where there was a discussion on how to improve the process of getting semester parking permits. Waiting in the Cashiers line was an issue brought up by students. V.P. Miyashiro had expressed an interest in an online process of purchasing parking permits through a private vendor.

A suggestion to hand out temporary paper permits through the mail until the student receives their semester permit may be a solution however; there is a possibility of fraud if the permits aren't serialized.

Permit Machines – Credit Cards Update

The Cabinet had approved the concept but the funding has not yet been approved.

Amy – The interactive map has been implemented. Erick has been helpful in giving updates. The students are using it and the program is doing well so far.

Lyn – Assembly Bill 302, which allows homeless students in good standing to park overnight in campus parking lots, will most likely pass. Networking and creating partnerships with outside social services as well as using our mental health and student services may help homeless students so that there will not be a need for them to be on campus overnight. She suggests working with Student Services to provide referrals to students. A committee or task force may be needed.

Erick – Kids College starts July 1st and the pickup/drop off location is in Lot A north so expect traffic in that area.

The traffic circle in lot C has opened for pickup and drop off. There are no signs there yet until the building has been completed and turned over to the campus.
