Student Success: ECC Physics Team Wins Silver!

Congrats to the El Camino College physics team, which recently won a silver medal in an international competition. Team members Huy Ho, Keith Inouye, and Kenta Morimoto participated in the University Physics Competition, a contest for undergrads. The ECC team ranked eighth out of 73 on their problem, directly competing with many four-year colleges and universities such as Duke University, University of Pennsylvania, and Georgia Institute of Technology.

For this competition, each team analyzed an open-ended physics problem at their home colleges and universities and wrote a formal paper describing the work. This year, the ECC team addressed the problem, "Golfing around a Tree." In this scenario, a poor shot has placed a golf ball so that a tree lies directly between the ball and the green. ECC professor and team adviser John Coroneus prepared the team for the competition, but as outlined in the contest rules, did not speak to them about this specific problem – they were entirely on their own. The students used a mathematical model and computer simulations to find various solutions, one of which put the golf ball on the green in just one shot! A physics success!

Guest astronaut Williams, who has spent a total of 322 days in space and holds the record for total spacewalk time by a female astronaut, will give a presentation to students.
