

OR


12.3 million students are enrolled in community college



How can the goals of all parts of the learning environment (system) be aligned to support high quality learning and student success?


Innovation Strategies

Traditional methods are sufficient	Traditional methods fail


- Which policies, programs, and procedures do we keep?












