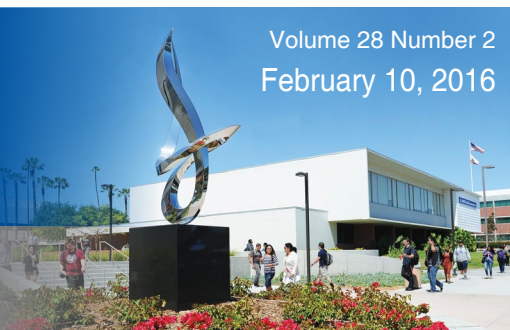

## ECC Eligible for Prestigious Aspen Prize

El Camino College was declared eligible for the prestigious 2017 Aspen Prize for Community College Excellence. The \$1 million Aspen Prize is given every two years to the top community college in the country, recognizing high achievement and performance. Eligible colleges demonstrate exceptional outcomes in three areas: student success in persistence, completion, and transfer; consistent improvement in outcomes over time; and equity in outcomes for students of all racial/ethnic and socioeconomic backgrounds.

The award program is a partnership of the Aspen Institute, the Bank of America Charitable Foundation, the Joyce Foundation, the Kresge Foundation, and Lumina Foundation, which supports educational excellence and the Aspen Prize. The 150 eligible institutions are now invited to submit an application describing what they have done to improve student success on their campus. Ten finalists will be announced this fall, and a winner declared in early 2017.

## Measure E Bonds Issued

The El Camino Community College District recently issued \$100 million in new bonds at a low interest rate of 3.45 percent to fund facilities improvements. The district also refinanced a portion of its outstanding general obligation bonds to generate approximately \$24.5 million in total savings, which will be directly passed on to local taxpayers in the form of reduced property tax bills over time.

The bond sale was well received by investors, and, in most maturities, the demand for the bonds exceeded the available supply. Demand for the bonds was primarily driven by the district's strong credit rating and its location in the stable South Bay region of Los Angeles County.

## Accreditation Update

At its January 6-8, 2016 meeting, the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges (ACCJC) reviewed El Camino College's Follow-Up Report, evidentiary materials, and the October 2015 Follow-Up Visit Evaluation Team Report. The Commission found that El Camino College has addressed Recommendations 1, 2, and 3 from the fall 2014 comprehensive evaluation, resolved the deficiencies, and meets ACCJC standards. The next scheduled report is the College Midterm Report due by March 15, 2017. Thank you to everyone who contributed to this effort.

The district's ability to issue the bonds at a low interest rate will correspondingly reduce the burden of paying back the bonds on local taxpayers.

In addition, the district availed itself of the near-historic low interest rate environment to refinance approximately \$98 million in previously issued bonds. Similar to the refinancing of a home mortgage, savings are generated by reducing original interest rates to a new lower rate, thereby reducing the amount in payments required over time to pay off the bonds.

## Spring Enrollment

Spring 2016 enrollment remains below the full-time equivalent students (FTES) target at both El Camino College and ECC Compton Center. As of Feb. 1, ECC was 10 percent away from the goal of 8,658 FTES. The FTES target for the 2015-16 academic year is 20,071. El Camino College Compton Center is 12 percent below its spring 2016 FTES target of 2,447. ECC Compton Center has a target FTES of 6,060 for the 2015-16 academic year. We will have a better idea later this spring where we are in relation to the academic year goals. Enrollment Management Committees at ECC and at the ECC Compton Center are developing plans to support the enrollment management goals and ensure access for students.

**Students can still register for spring classes:** Mid-term classes are available and also add to the FTES count. These short-term classes begin March 19 and can be completed in just a few weeks. Students should refer to the [Online Searchable Schedule](#) for more information.
