
FREE College Classes!

Apply Now for Priority Registration

Now is the time to apply for financial aid! The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) determines eligibility for state and federal grants, as well as additional school aid. Financial aid can help cover fees, books and other expenses. ECC also has a diverse scholarship program that awards more than 650 scholarships totaling over \$1.4 million annually to incoming high school students, students attending ECC and students transferring to a four-year college or university.

Cost Comparison

El Camino College offers an excellent education at the best value

It costs California residents only about \$1,400 per year to attend El Camino College. We offer the same general education courses as UC and CSU schools – and students save thousands of dollars. In fact, students can earn their bachelor's degree with half the amount of student debt just by starting at ECC and then transferring to a four-year college or university.

A full-time student enrolled in 12 units for two semesters pays \$1,400 per year in enrollment fees at El Camino College, in comparison to \$31,200 (private), \$14,700 (UC), and \$6,700 (CSU).



Financial aid, such as fee waivers, grants, scholarships, work study programs and loans, is available year-round. This money can be used to help pay for fees, books, supplies, and sometimes even living expenses. Priority Registration in 4 Steps!

APPLY - PREPARE - TEST - PLAN

All new students are required to complete the Steps to Enrollment prior to registering for classes at El Camino College.

APPLY - New students must complete an application.

PREPARE - All new students must participate in an orientation session.


TEST - Assessment testing must be completed prior to registering for classes.

PLAN - Students must meet with a counselor prior to registration to develop an education plan.
