Satin Brass is known for showcasing the regal elegance of brass music in its repertoire of Renaissance, baroque, classical, jazz, and popular works. The lush sonority of these brass instruments provides audiences with a range of sounds and styles.

Coomber studied trombone at California State University, Northridge where he received a bachelor's degree in music (cum laude) and later received a master's degree in trombone performance and literature from the Eastman School of Music.
