
Student Success

In 2006, following the former Compton College's accreditation being revoked, the El Camino Community College District agreed to partner with the Compton Community College District to provide academic programs and student support services.

Student success is central to our mission of meeting the educational needs of our community, a goal achieved by offering quality, comprehensive academic opportunities. Faculty and staff support student success by working together to provide excellence in academic programs and services.

From the Class of 2011, approximately 80 students will transfer to four-year colleges and universities. Of these graduates, 55 will transfer to CSU, six will transfer to UC, and 15 are headed to private/out-of-state colleges and universities.

The number of El Camino College Compton Center students earning degrees has increased more than 700 percent from 2007 to 2011.

he First Year Experience program is designed to help students new to college find the resources they need to succeed. Students learn how to study independently and in groups; choose a major and create a career plan; as well as access and manage electronic information, such as email, Internet, and library databases.

Aerospace Fastener Program

The El Camino College Compton Center Aerospace Fastener Program was introduced in fall 2008 as the first collegelevel training program of its kind in the western United States, quickly becoming a high-demand program with an extensive waiting list.

Funding and Grants

A dditional revenues have been provided to El Camino College Compton Center in the form of grant awards and other support. Funds have been used to initiate a variety of new academic offerings, while improving existing programs.

Nearly \$1.6 million in grant support has been provided to El Camino College Compton Center since 2006.

During the past five years, additional support was made available to El Camino College Compton Center in the form of invaluable donations of materials and equipment to important programs, such as 20 lap tops for the Mathematics and Natural Science Division from Southern California Edison and tool kits to the Women in Technology program from the Nissan Foundation.

Approximately \$10,000 from the 2010 Title V Mini Grant program was awarded to innovative projects aimed at improving student success.

very student is a success story at El Camino College Compton Center. Student achievements are evident through the various scholarship awards, academic activities, and athletic endeavors.

Nearly 60 El Camino College Compton Center students received scholarships in 2011, for a total of \$46,100.

The ongoing "Need Cash for College?" financial aid awareness campaign has shown positive results. In 2011, 3,244 students submitted Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) forms, a 12 percent increase from the year before. The campaign included workshops, "Cash for College" fairs, and outreach to high school students.

Survey Says


