Honors Transfer Program

Students Present Research at UC Irvine

Students in the prestigious El Camino College Honors Transfer Program (HTP) recently attended the Seventh Annual Student Research Conference at the University of California at Irvine.

The conference was sponsored by the Honors Transfer Council of California to give community college students an opportunity to present undergraduate research in a university setting and to have abstracts printed in a university publication.

An all-time record of 10 El Camino College

students presented their research in front of students and faculty from all over California.

The HTP is designed to prepare the highly motivated student to transfer to a university. Of last year's HTP graduates, more than half were accepted to UCLA; a record number of HTP students transferred to UC Berkeley; and about 90% of HTP students were accepted into their first-choice university. UCLA considers El Camino as one of the top three transfer colleges, with a historic transfer rate as high as any other college.

Hundreds of young scientists-in-training came to El Camino College this spring for the 21st Annual Onizuka Space Science Day. It was all about the science of space all day long with plenty of hands-on science experi-



ments and a visit from a NASA astronaut.

El Camino College graduate Lt. Col. E. Michael Fincke, the visiting astronaut a few years ago, was recently named by NASA as commander of one of three crews that will live and work aboard the International Space Station over the next two years.

Fincke will be in charge of Expedition 18, set to launch from Space Station in fall 2008, to return in spring 2009.

"The time I spent at El Camino College helped give me the competitive edge I needed to further my career in space exploration," he said while visiting the ECC campus.

El Camino College student Deborah Dauda recently traveled to Harvard University's New England Science Symposium to present her research project.

Deborah joined top-performing students countrywide and discussed her work: "Myostatin Effect on Body Composition and Muscle Physical Performance in Genetically Modified Mice." She studied Myostatin (MST), a negative regulator of skeletal muscle mass that affects muscle function, fiber number and size.

Deborah is active in the El Camino College MESA (Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement) program. Since she began in MESA as a biology major, she has participated in many activities, such as the Spring 2006 MESA Leadership Retreat in Santa Cruz; the Fall 2006 PG&E Student Leadership Development Training in San Ramon; the 2007 Society of Hispanic Professional Engineers National Technical Career Conference in Denver; and several academic workshops in math and chemistry.

Forensics Brings Home Two National Titles

There's nothing to debate – the El Camino College forensics team had its best season ever – with two national championships!

The most recent award came from the Phi Rho Pi National Championships, staged in Houston. ECC advanced four of its five teams to elimination rounds (no other community college advanced more than two teams to elimination rounds), and won the national championship in debate. The following students won debate awards and contributed to the national championship:

This year, El Camino College won the National Parliamentary Debate Association National Sweepstakes for community colleges and placed third (behind Point Loma and Western Kentucky) among all 257 ranked universities.

SSTARS On Campus

Student services – all wrapped up and ready to go! The El Camino College SSTARS Program brings it all together – 26 different service programs designed to help students complete their educational goals. Need a certificate or an AA/AS degree? Maybe you want to transfer to a four-year institution, or enhance skills? SSTARS can help.

Students can find out how to get books; how to apply for graduation; how to pay for various special needs like bus tokens, application fees for athletic programs, and other necessities. The SSTARS Program also coordinates fund-raising efforts to benefit projects such as the Library Book Depot where student can borrow textbooks for use in the library. This year a \$2,000 donation was made, with a goal for \$4,000 next year. A Scholarship Fund was also created this year, with three \$500 scholarships going to deserving students.

Word about the accomplishments of the SSTARS Program has made the rounds. The program is considered a model of success and other colleges have requested information so they can create a similar program.
