Outreach and School Relations: Services

Application Workshop

An Outreach representative will provide a brief presentation about the enrollment process before assisting students who would like to apply to El Camino College.

- High school campuses must provide working computers with Internet access.
- Minimum of 10 students in attendance.
- Students must have a personal email set up.
- Students must bring/know SSN (if they have one) or tax identification number.

Campus Tours

Prospective students will have the opportunity to ask questions, receive insight into student campus life, become familiar with various resources available and explore the El Camino College Campus.

- Tours must be scheduled <u>AT LEAST</u> two weeks in advanced.
- Individual Tours:
 - Maximum of 10 students per party.
 - Tours are only available Tuesday, Thursday and Friday starting from 9 a.m., 10 a.m., 3 p.m., 4 p.m.

Group Tours

- Must have 11 or more students per party
- Campus tour dates and times vary according to availability.

Assessment Testing

An Outreach representative will proctor and monitor on-and off-campus assessment tests.

- High school must provide working computers with Internet access.
- Minimum of 20 students in attendance.
- Students <u>must know their ECC student I.D.</u> number.
- Please allot at least two hours for students to complete the assessment test.
- Assessment testing sessions will be scheduled for the months of November through March.

Presentations

Information Session: Students will be given a brief overview of services provided at El Camino College, general community college system, and steps to enroll in our college. A full information session can be 45 minutes long, but it can be altered for various lengths of time.

MyECC 101: Students will receive a presentation on how to navigate **MyECC**, register for courses, pay fees, etc. Please allot one hr and 30 minutes for the presentation and Q&A.

What to Expect Your First Semester: This presentation will help clarify any doubts, fears, and answer any questions students will have their first semester.

Information Table

An outreach representative will set up a table with literature about our services and be available to answer any questions students may have.

 Can be scheduled monthly, weekly, or biweekly at your school site.

Financial Aid Information Session

Students who are interested in attending a college or university may attend a financial aid information session. Students will be provided with resources and information regarding federal and state aid.

If there are special needs or accommodations for students using our services, please let us know when submitting a Service Request Form so we can make the appropriate arrangements beforehand.

Becoming an El Camino College Student



The following pages outlined in this guidebook are free resources available to El Camino College students. Brief information will be highlighted regarding the services we offer as well as the contact information of each department should you have questions.

Steps to Enrollment

Step 1: Apply Online

- Go online to www.elcamino.edu and select "Apply online" to file a college application.
- A student ID number and email will be issued within two to three business days after submitting the application.
- Concurrent Enrollment: Students must apply every semester they plan on taking a course at El Camino College.

Step 2: Orientation and Preparation

- All new students are required to participate in an orientation regarding El Camino College and its resources.
- Orientations can be accessed online via MyECC or in person at the counseling office.

Step 3: Assessment

- Testing must be completed before registering for classes.
- No appointment necessary for English, ESL (Part 1) and math placement tests.
- Must have a valid photo ID and ECC ID number.

Step 4: Educational Plan

- Students are required to meet with an El Camino College counselor prior to registration in order to develop an educational plan.
- ♦ Schedule a counseling appointment via MyECC.
- Once all four steps are completed, you may begin registering for your classes.
- All fees must be pain in full by the deadline.

Concurrent Enrollment

El Camino College Board Policy 5060 allows concurrent enrollment only to students who have successfully completed the 10th grade or to students who are currently enrolled in the 11th or 12th grade. In addition, **enrollment fees are waived for California residents**. Non-residents, out-of-state and out-of-country students will pay the appropriate tuition. Please consult a current class schedule for tuition requirements.

11th or 12th Grade Students' Steps to Enroll:

1) Apply for admissions and submit your Concurrent Enrollment Application, found on our website: https://www.elcamino.edu/studentservices/highschool/docs/1112APP08.pdf. You may turn in your application to the Admissions and Records Office or mail your concurrent enrollment form to:

- 2) Clear any prerequisites for the classes you wish to enroll prior to registering for classes by taking the math or English placement exam or by meeting with an ECC counselor.
- 3) Register for classes on your designated appointment login to **MyECC** from our home page for your registration date and time.

Concurrent Enrollment Expectations and Responsibilities

Student, Parent or Guardian and principal or designee, by signing this Concurrent Enrollment Application you acknowledge that you have read and understand the following:

- Before deciding to concurrently enroll at ECC, students should review course offerings in the schedule of classes and current ECC
 Catalog noting dates, prerequisites, locations and times of class(es). Courses with a credit/no-credit grade option only, such as English
 A, B, R and 2R, may not be used for high school credit.
- 2. Applying for concurrent enrollment does not guarantee a seat in a class!
- 3. Enrollment fees are waived for California residents. Non-residents, out-of-country and out-of-state students will pay the appropriate tuition. Please consult a current class schedule for tuition requirements.
- 4. PROCESS TO ENROLL and REGISTER Complete the Application for Admission and this 11/12 Concurrent Enrollment Application and submit both forms to the Admissions Office at El Camino College located on the first floor of the Student Services Center. Applications may be submitted online but the 11/12 Concurrent Enrollment Application must still be submitted to the Admissions Office. Apply early, the applications for the winter and spring are accepted beginning Sept. 1 and the applications for the summer and fall are accepted beginning March 1. It is the student's responsibility to register for classes either online or by phone.
- 5. It is the student's responsibility to take care of any prerequisites and/or arrange for assessment and testing if necessary.
- 6. Review the Registration Information section of the current class schedule to find out how and when to register for classes.
- 7. Students will register <u>only</u> for the approved class(es). Registering for non-approved classes will result in loss of concurrent enrollment privileges, and forfeiture of most petitioning rights.
- 8. Enrollment is limited to 2 classes. Written permission from your school is required along with approval from El Camino College's Director of Admissions to enroll in more than two classes.
- Students not attending the first day <u>may</u> be dropped from the class.
- 10. Students must conduct themselves in a responsible and appropriate manner for a college environment (ECC Board Policy 5138).
- 11. All students are subject to the student code of conduct. It is the responsibility of the student to read and understand the student code of conduct and all relevant policies and procedures.
- 12. Students attending El Camino College are protected by the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA). Neither the parent (or their family member), nor a representative from the student's school may inquire about the student or obtain information on the student's academic performance, enrollment, or attendance without the expressed written consent of the student.
- 13. Ensure that the student meets all academic deadlines outlined in the semester calendar located in the ECC Schedule of Classes add and drop deadlines, and deadlines for withdrawing from a class with a "W" on the transcript.
- 14. Students must request transcripts if the high school requires transcripts for allowing high school credit. This can be completed at the Records Window in the Student Services Center.
- 15. Students must apply for concurrent enrollment each semester. Concurrently enrolled students do not receive continuing student status.
- 16. <u>Student's grade(s) will become part of their permanent academic record.</u> Classes are taught at the college level ensure that your maturity level and academic preparation is appropriate to the level of the class.
- 17. Ensure that the student has access to a parent, adult (i.e. cell phone) in case of emergency, class cancellation, campus evacuation, black-out or any non-planned event.
- 18. Students enrolled in Home Study Programs must provide proof that the Home Study Program is registered with the State of California.
- 19. Health Center fees are not charged and therefore students are not eligible for Health Center services.
- 20. Students are required to purchase textbooks and/or other materials required in the course syllabus or outline. Parking permits are also required if students intend to park on campus.
- 21. Content in some classes may not be suitable for minors. El Camino College reserves the right and has the responsibility to restrict 11/12 concurrent enrollment if it is determined that the student does not have the ability to benefit from enrollment or for reasons of health and safety, appropriateness of the course, preparedness of the student, seat availability, registration priority, or college policy.
- 22. All documents submitted to El Camino College become the property of El Camino College.

Financial Aid and Scholarships

El Camino College has a strong commitment to ensuring accessibility to all of its program and services to all students who are capable of benefiting from such programs and services.

Enrollment fee is ONLY \$46 per unit for California Residents.

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA):

Completing the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is the first step toward applying and receiving federal aid for college, technical school, or graduate school. El Camino College will use FAFSA data to determine eligibility for state and school aid. All students are encouraged to complete and submit a FAFSA by March 2 of each year.

Board of Governers (BOG) Fee Waiver:

California residents may apply for the California Community Colleges Board of Governors Fee Waiver (BOGFW), which waives the \$46 per unit enrollment fee. This fee waiver is for California residents, AB 540 students and eligible AB 1899 students, as determined by the Admissions & Records Office. Students who meet income and residency criteria may qualify.

California Dream Act:

The California Dream Act, became law through the passage of two Assembly Bills, AB 130 and AB 131.

<u>AB 130</u> allows students who meet AB 540 criteria (California Education Code 68130.5(a)) to apply for and receive non-state funded scholarships for public colleges and universities.

<u>AB 131</u> allows students who meet AB 540 criteria to apply for and receive state-funded financial aid such as grants, community college fee waivers, like the Board of Governors Grant (BOG), Cal Grant, and Chafee Grant.

Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) \$600

- Pell Grant: A need-based federal grant based on the cost of attendance of the college or university and expected family contribution. Students must not already have a bachelor's degree in order to qualify. There are a total of four disbursements through the academic year.
- ♦ **Board of Governors (BOG):** Aid given to California residents who demonstrate the financial need. BOG only covers enrollment fees. No cash disbursement.
- ♦ **Federal Work Study:** A federal student aid program through which students may gain employment on-campus in order to earn money to pay for school.
- Cal Grant: A need-based state grant that has a March 2 deadline via FAFSA.
- ♦ **Chafee Grant:** A need-based state grant for students currently or former foster or unaccompanied youth.
- ♦ **Federal Supplemental Education Opportunity Grant (FSEOG):** A need-based federal grant. One of the most competitive grants due to limited funds.

Career and Technical Education (CTE)

El Camino College offers a variety of certificate programs. A Certificate of Achievement is recorded on a student's transcript, in contrast, a Certificate of Accomplishment is not recorded on the transcript. Each of the programs requires completion of courses in a particular field. Unlike degree programs, courses outside the field are not generally required.



Certificate of Achievement

- <u>Certificate of Achievement:</u> is awarded to students who complete the prescribed program with a 2.0 grade point average.
- <u>Certificate of Achievement with Honors:</u> is awarded to students who complete the prescribed program with a 3.0 grade point average.
- <u>Certificate of Achievement with High Honors:</u> is awarded to students who complete the prescribed program with a 3.5 grade point average or above.

Certificate of Accomplishment

• <u>Certificate of Accomplishment:</u> is awarded to students who complete the prescribed program with a 2.0 grade point average or above.

Transfer Pathway

Students who intend to transfer to a four-year college or university must complete the admission requirements at the community college prior to transferring. Requirements vary among institutions. Therefore, students should become familiar with courses for: 1) general education, 2) major preparation, 3) admission requirements to meet minimum eligibility and selective majors, and 4) grade point average (GPA) needed for admission.

Admission requirements may change from year to year. It is to the student's advantage to select a transfer institution as early as possible and meet with an academic counselor, transfer center adviser, the university representative, and/or articulation officer for updated information.


Intersegmental General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC)

IGETC is a series of courses prospective transfer students attending a community college may complete to satisfy the lower division breadth/general education requirements at both the University of California and California State University. The IGETC must be completed prior to transfer. The universities have an agreement with each of the California Community Colleges that specifies which of the courses may be applied to each category of the IGETC. All courses must be completed with a grade of C or better.

IGETC is most helpful to students who want to keep their options open. Certain majors however will not be well served by following IGETC. Students who intend to transfer into majors that require extensive lower division preparation, such as those in engineering or the physical and natural sciences, should concentrate on completing as many prerequisites for the major as possible before transferring.

General UC Transfer Admissions Guarantee (TAG)

By participating in a Transfer Admission Guarantee (TAG) program, you will receive early review of your academic records, early admission notification, and specific guidance about major preparation and general education coursework.

TAG Requirement Agreement:


- You must meet the definition of a California Community College student.
- Complete at least <u>60 transferrable</u>
 <u>semester units</u> by the end of spring prior to fall admission.
- You can only TAG with one UC except for UCLA, UCB, and UCSD.
- Complete the following seven-course pattern requirements, earning a grade of C or better in each course by the end of the spring semester prior to fall admission:

- Two UC transferable college courses in English Composition.
- ii. One UC transferable college course in mathematical concepts.
- iii. UC Transferable college courses selected from among at least two of the following three areas:




