For decades, Amy Lowell, daughter of one of the wealthiest families in America was searching for direction in her life. Progressivism and the 1912 Presidential Election Presented by El Camino College History

The Progressive Movement (1890-1918) emerged during a period in American history of tremendous economic and demographic change including the advent of the industrial age and an influx of immigrants arriving in the United States that introduced new political traditions and an emergent capitalist class. These new capitalist industrial barons were perceived by "Progressives" as a threat to American life and traditional values of individual achievement and Republican government. The 1912 presidential election marked the birth of the Progressive Party and a call for a "New Nationalism" based on progressive reform.


