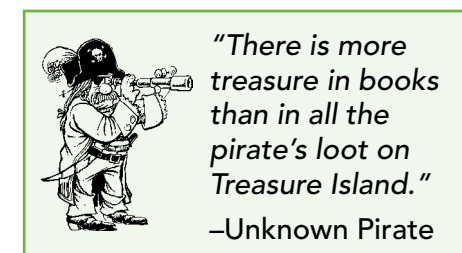
PARKING ON CAMPUS

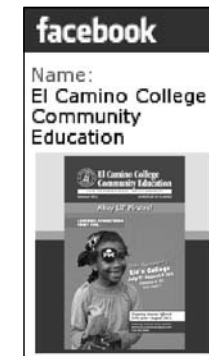

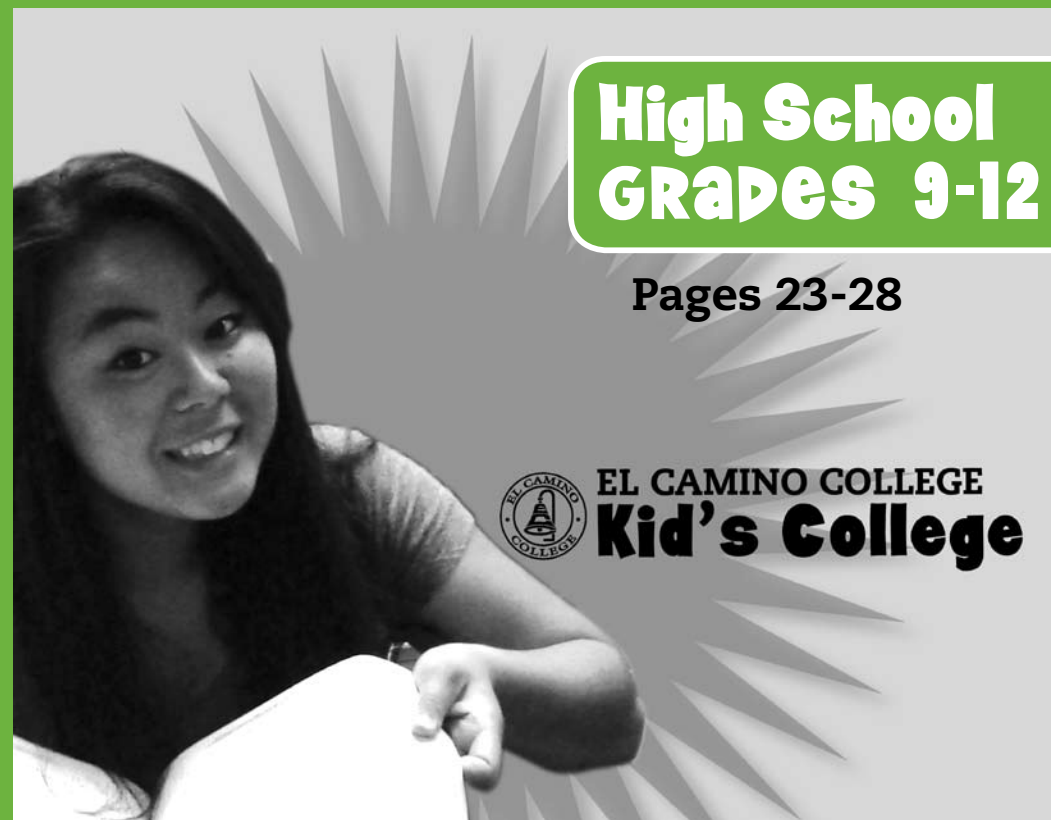

Homebrewing Fun Facts

Homebrewing was legalized by former President Jimmy Carter in 1979. The law permits you to brew 100 gallons of homebrew per year if you live on your own, or 200 gallons per household with two or more adults.

Only two states have not made homebrewing legal: Alabama and Mississippi. Homebrewing was most recently legalized in Oklahoma (August 26, 2010).

May 7th is National Homebrew Day. This was made official by congress in 1988.

Every year since 1979, there has been a National Homebrew Competition. The first competition had 34 entries. In 2010, there were 6,287 entries

Brewing in the home began several thousand years ago coinciding with the dawn of agriculture.

Reinheitsgebot, the famous German Purity Law of 1516, stated that beer can only contain water, barley, and hops. Yeast was not a known ingredient until the 1800s and was not added to the German law until the 20th century. Reinheitsgebot remained in effect until 1987.

Estimates by the American Homebrewers Association indicate there are currently about 750,000 homebrewers in America.

Washington and Jefferson were both homebrewers.
