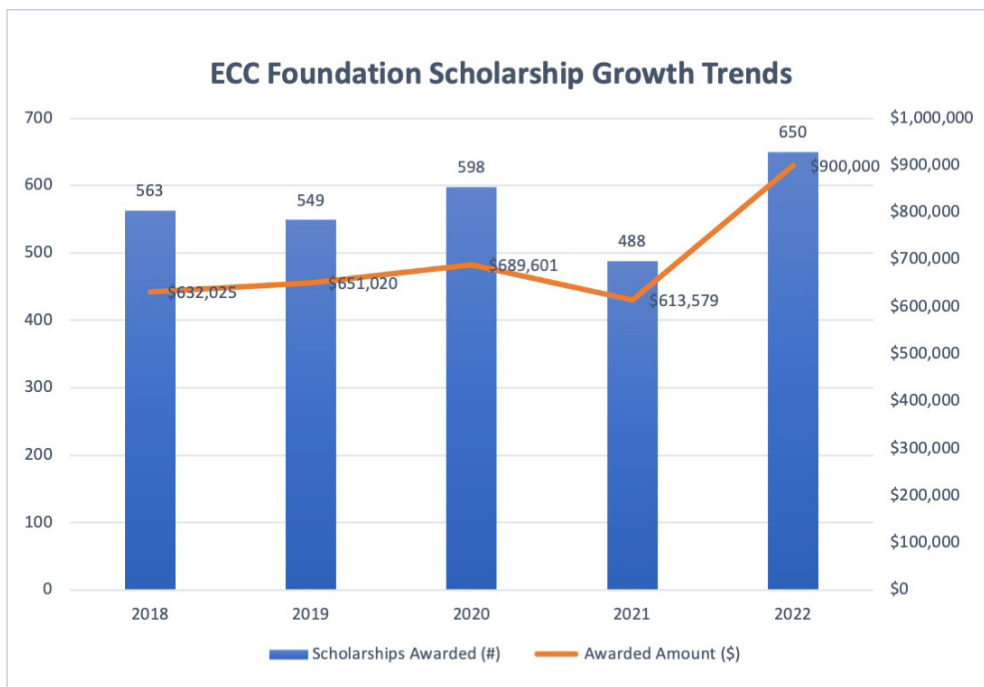

Social Justice Center Holds Ribbon Cutting to Promote Equity for All



El Camino College's Social Justice Center held a ribbon cutting ceremony on September 28. The center will serve as a gathering hub for various student groups working on equity and inclusion initiatives, as well as a place to host cultural events and activities.

The idea for the center began in 2020 when Giancarlo Fernandez was president of the Associated Students Organization. He credits the diverse community at El Camino College that made him feel accepted and supported as a first generation and low-income student of color, as the premise for the Social Justice Center. El Camino's administration wholeheartedly embraced the center's mission and worked to secure project funding and a location in the Communications building.

According to Ross Miyashiro, Vice President of Student Services, the center will expand to include several other affinity centers including the Black students access center, Latino/a center, immigrant student success center, LGBTQIA+ center, and formerly incarcerated students center.

While the social justice center will serve as a space for action and advocacy, Fernandez also hopes it will be a place for relaxation and relationship building. Above all, he does not want it to become



just another study space and perpetuate that idea that the only support a student needs is academic related. Three years later, Giancarlo Fernandez's dream of educational attainment and success of underrepresented student groups has become a reality.

Basic Needs Center Expands Services with New Warrior Closet to Help Outfit Students



El Camino's newly established Basic Needs Center helps provide educationally disadvantaged, underrepresented, and/or underserved students with resources to financial stability; nutritious and sufficient food; safe, secure and adequate housing; accessible and equitable medical care; technology; clothing; and transportation.

The Basic Needs Center's resources include the Warrior Pantry, Warrior Closet, ECC CalFresh Outreach and other support programs. The center also provides education and training to ensure that the El Camino campus community knows how to respond to students facing basic needs insecurities. The Center helps empower students and connects them to support services.

The Warrior Closet is managed by Sharonda Barksdale and provides El Camino students with clothes for themselves and their families. The Warrior Closet was originally established in 2018 as a small pop-up shop, twice a month. Since then, it has expanded to a full retail campus location and shopping experience. The Warrior

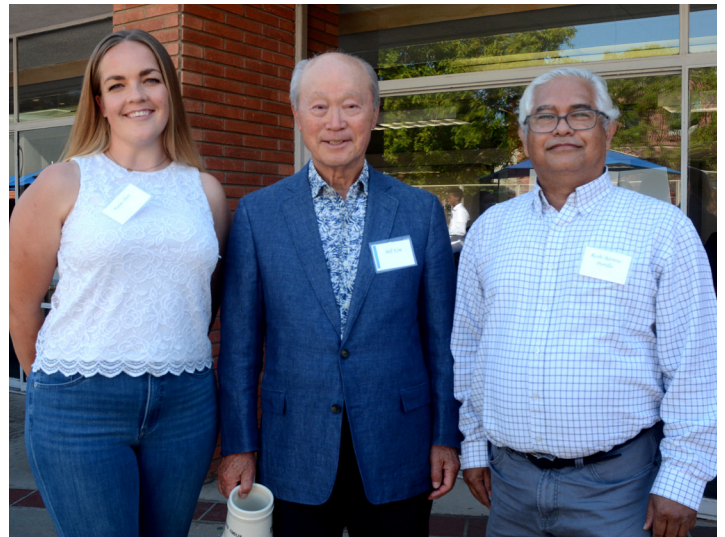
\$1 Million Scholarship Established Through

Through the extreme generosity of El Camino College alumnus Bill Kim, a \$1 million scholarship was established to provide nearly 50, \$2,000 scholarships annually for ten years, to foreign-born students attending El Camino. The scholarships will be funded at \$100,000 per year for a total of ten years. Bill Kim, and his late wife Mary, were immigrants themselves, and according to Mr. Kim, his experience at El Camino College as a young man created a positive beginning to his successful education and career.

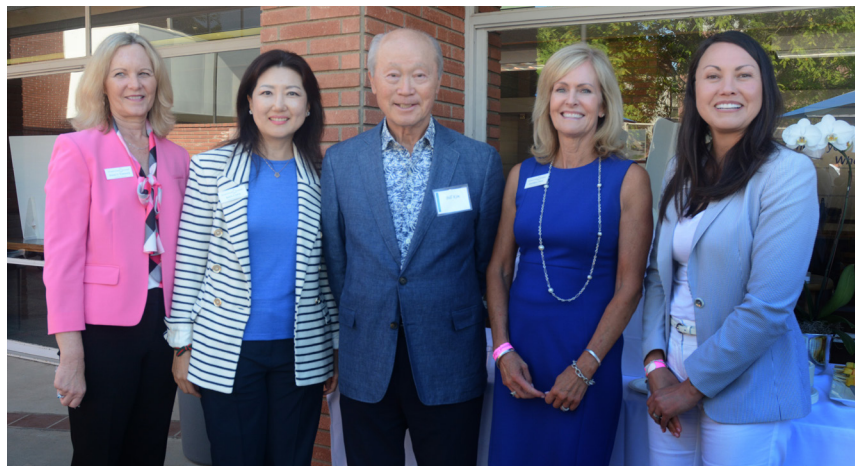
In order to qualify for the scholarship, students must carry a minimum of 9 units per semester and maintain a GPA of 2.0 or above. Each year, a reception may be held to allow Mr. Kim the chance to meet the students and learn their history and how the scholarship will impact their lives.

El Camino College Offers New Baccalaureate Degree



By 2030, nearly 40% of California jobs will require at least a baccalaureate degree. Expanding the Baccalaureate Degree Program at the community college level will help California meet regional workforce needs, and in turn, support local and state economic vitality. To answer this need, El Camino College was approved to offer its first advanced Bachelor Degree in respiratory care. This program will provide El Camino students the opportunity to earn a four-year degree from a community college. This will help grow degree attainment in California and help train the local workforce.

The Baccalaureate Degree Program, which began in 2014, became permanent last year when Governor Gavin Newsom signed AB 927. The bill allows for an expansion of up to 30 new bachelor's degree programs annually at community colleges.

These programs reflect the critical role community colleges play in the state's economy and in the lives of many Californians.

Approximately 51% of CSU graduates and 29% of UC graduates began their educational career at a California community college. Californians will now have an affordable and direct pipeline to baccalaureate degrees. The programs provide accessible bachelor's degrees and offer a high-quality education at community colleges that already have associate degrees in the same fields of study.

This program will provide El Camino students the opportunity to earn a four-year degree from a community college.
