



Eligible Support Programs

Athletics

Warrior Athletics provides student-athletes competition in the California Community College Athletic Association (CCCAA) in 22 intercollegiate athletic programs. Studentathletes acquire skill, sportsmanship and scholarship during their two years of competition with a goal of transfer.

Behavioral Social Sciences/Student Equity and Achievement (BSS/SEA) Pathway

The BSS/SEA Pathway is designed to facilitate the academic and college success of students by integrating Behavioral and Social Science curriculum, student equity and student services in courses that are designated as myPATH.

Computer Science Learning Community

The Computer Science Learning Community provides a pathway for students to complete a Bachelor's Degree in Computer Science. Students will take major classes together, study together, and receive significant additional support including cohort enrichment workshops, professional development, tutoring, priority registration, \$2,000 need-based scholarships, and guidance to apply for competitive internship experiences.

Extended Opportunity Programs & Services (EOPS)

EOPS at El Camino College is dedicated to the delivery of a comprehensive program that encourages the enrollment, retention, and transfer of students who are challenged by language, social, economic, and educational disadvantages.

First Year Experience (FYE)

Starting a new educational journey can be exciting and overwhelming! El Camino College's First Year Experience program is designed to help recent high school graduates succeed in their first year of college by providing a supportive environment and specialized education and career services.

Honors Transfer Program (HTP)

HTP is for highly-motivated students who want to transfer to the best four-year universities, which give them special consideration for acceptance following completion of the program. Program benefits include priority registration, designated honors classes, smaller class sizes, transferrelated workshops, and scholarship opportunities.

Mathematics, Engineering, Science Achievement (MESA) Program

MESA provides academic support, enrichment opportunities and financial resources to students who plan to transfer to four-year universities in a calculus-based major in Mathematics, Engineering or Science. MESA resources help students create a sense of community, belonging and identity, and are designed to increase student retention, success, graduation, and transfer in STEM fields

MANA

MANA's purpose is to help El Camino students of Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander descent succeed in their academic journey while integrating their cultural identity into the process. At the core of MANA are the Native Hawaiian and Pacific Islander values of respect, integrity, commitment, and compassion.

Puente Program

The Puente Program provides English courses, counseling, and mentoring. The goal is to assist students that wish to transfer to a four-year university through transferable courses and educational events, activities, and workshops. Puente focuses on a Latino/multicultural emphasis in both the college transferable English and Human Development courses which the students are placed in a cohort for one academic year.

Special Resource Center (SRC)

The Special Resource Center's (SRC) primary goal is to provide the accommodations necessary to assist students with achieving their educational and vocational goals, while promoting self-advocacy and independent learning. The SRC provides support services, accommodations for academic college activities, adaptive equipment and computer technology, assistive technology training, and specialized instruction to serve students with verified disabilities.

TEACH El Camino

The TEACH El Camino Teacher Education Program was created in response to California's projected need for teachers over the next decade. Through partnerships with local universities, TEACH offers courses and fieldwork for those planning to teach at all grade levels as well as for students interested in other careers within the field of education, including school administration, school counseling, school psychology, school social work, school librarian, school nurse, and speech/language pathology.

Umoja-Project Success

The Umoja-Project Success program is an affiliate of the state-wide student support program called the Umoja Community. It is a guided pathway program that consists of mandatory courses during the first two years of the students' participation. The Umoja Community actively services and promotes student success for all students through a curriculum and pedagogy responsive to the legacy of the African Diasporas.

When you join the program, you'll be part of a learning community that understand you and helps you achieve your education goals. In fact, community colleges with Puente Programs transfer 44% more Latino students to the University of California than colleges without the Puente Program.

JOIN OUR COHORT

A cohort is the same group of students enrolled in the same classes together charing a bond and creating a community. The work in one class relates to the work in other classes and supports the assignments and understanding of each student in the learning community.




