Black History Month is an annual celebration of achievements by African Americans and a time for recognizing their central roles in U.S. history. The event grew out of "Negro History Week", created in February 1926 by Carter G. Woodson. Since 1976, every U.S. president officially designated the month of February as Black History Month. Other countries, including Canada and the United Kingdom, devote a month to celebrating Black history.

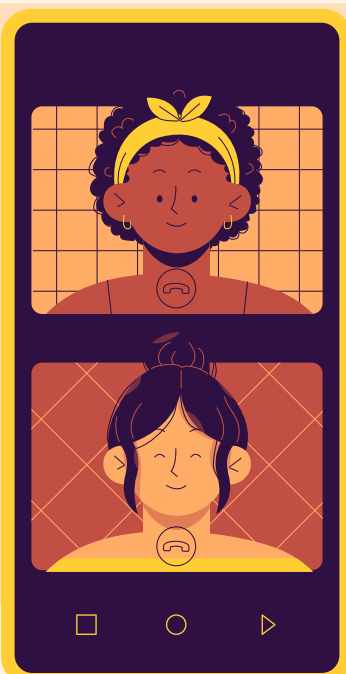
