Monica Fredericks is a dedicated community volunteer and has supported many causes, starting at the young age of 7 years old. She is a founding member of Old Torrance Neighbors and served as a PTA board member, Los Angeles County poll worker and inspector, and a volunteer for the California Health Care Coalition. Fredericks was president of the Torrance Rotary "Anns" and the South Bay Cooperative Preschool. She attended El Camino College after high school and returned later to enroll in child development courses. She currently serves on the Torrance Education Foundation Board and has worked with students with a diagnosis of autism for more than a decade at the Torrance Unified School District.

Dr. Gregory Rafijah is an assistant clinical professor at UC Irvine School of Medicine's Department of Orthopedic Surgery as a specialist of hand, wrist and elbow disorders and microvascular surgery. He is actively involved in training residents and fellows, and has a very busy practice performing elective surgery and handling traumatic injuries.
