ECC Commencement Congratulations Class of 2018! El Camino College celebrated its 71st Annual Commencement on June 8th in Murdock Stadium. Addressing the Class of 2018 was Retired Major General Megan Tatu, an ECC Distinguished Alumna. Tatu retired from the U.S. Army in 2017 after 39 years of active and reserve service. At the time of her retirement, she served as the U.S. Army Reserve Command Chief of Staff at Ft. Bragg, North Carolina.

"Graduates, it has been our privilege today to hear from a distinguished El Camino College alumna whose life embodies the noble principle of service," said El Camino College President Dena P. Maloney in her opening remarks. "For her, it has taken the form of service to our country as a member of and a leader in our nation's armed forces. Service can take many forms. We can all serve our families and our communities through our leadership and dedication to others. Whenever you find yourself in a position to serve, you'll be ready because of the experience you had here at El Camino." Additionally, those who have served in the military were asked to stand and be recognized for their service to our country.
