

The 2024 Employee Engagement Survey

- Survey launch on 9/3/2024.
- Survey closes on 9/18/2024.
- Survey administered by third-party vendor (McLean & Company).
- Survey responses are 100% confidential with no ability for campus personnel to access raw data.
- Last survey was launched in 2022; full participation needed to analyze data for any trends.

Why is it important to participate in the 2024 **Employee** Engagement Survey





BRIEF RECAP of the 2022 Employee Engagement Survey

- 57% response rate.
- Survey showed (3) areas to improve in: Recognition, Department Collaboration, and Executive Leadership.

SOME CHANGES SINCE 2022:

- Revamp of the "Adjunct of the Year" recognition process and rubric for greater inclusiveness.
- Rubric for the "Distinguished Staff" recognition award was published online for transparency.
- All campus-wide collegial consultation committees are now posted on Board Docs for transparency.
- All online Town Halls are "open" allowing for raised hands, the chat feature kept on, and self-unmuting capabilities (all as a standard business practice).



 - Additional programs set to begin by Fall 2025 include Certified Nursing Assistant (CNA), Phlebotomy, and Adult High School Diploma

Budget Status

Baseline is the 2024-2025 Tentative Budget Adopted by the Board in June 2024

<u>State applied a deficit factor of 2.41% resulting</u> <u>in \$5,200,000 less revenue – solutions needed!</u> Board will adopt the Final 2024-2025 Budget at the September 2024 Board meeting

Budget Strategies Leadership Group

- The BSLG had identified and worked towards identifying the required spending reductions and revenue increases to balance the anticipated 2024-2025 budget. As of June 2024 all we had to do was execute the plan. Then the July 2024 Appropriation revenue was disbursed ...
- A State Deficit of 2.41% or \$5.2 million for 2024-2025 needs to be solved. The previous plan needs to be updated ASAP and execute to the new plan. BSLG has restarted meetings in August 2024.
- There is NO one specific spending reduction which will solve the current shortfalls.
- Current reduction requirements are: 2024-2025 at \$ 5,517,485 2025-2026 at \$11,289,286

Supplemental Retirement Program

The Board has approved the investigation of a Supplemental Retirement Program. Major issues to know at the current time:

- 1- Significant financial savings must be realized in order to implement
- 2- Information forthcoming kick off meetings, individualized financial projections, group and individual meetings
- 4- Employees electing to participate MUST complete PARS (vendor) and ECC

Paperwork and *Employee must provide specific documentation to PARS*

There are specific due dates that must be met – no exceptions

3- Final decision to move forward will be the November 2024 Board meeting
