- Our front desk phone line is generally supported by our front desk agents, division staff and advisors. In the month of May, the Counseling and Student Success Division welcomed slightly over 1,800 callers, this is a record high for this year.

Ask an Advisor

Ask An Advisor for Spring is officially over. In the spring term, Meta-Major Advisors met with 153 students at the Schauerman Library lobby; of these meetings, 35 received appointments with our counselors.

EOPS

- EOPS is accepting applications for Fall 2025.

- We will continue to have group counseling and group advising sessions weekly. Students will be invited if they meet the criteria to participate.
- 72 students participated in our annual Student Recognition Ceremony.
- 261 EOPS students will be graduating this June 2025.
- The last day for EOPS students to complete their contacts is June 13, 2025, at 1:00 p.m.

CARE

- The CARE program is closing out the semester with 120 parenting students for Spring 2025. 21 CARE students will either graduate, complete a certificate/degree, or transfer this semester.
- 106 CARE students have completed all 3 required EOPS contacts this semester. CARE staff will
 continue to support students in completing program requirements through Friday, June 13th.
- 110 CARE Students have received at least one set of service cards this semester. 46 have received all 3 sets of cards thus far.

CalWORKs

- CalWORKs continues to accept new students for summer and fall 2025
- We currently have 190 students enrolled for Spring 2025 and 99 students enrolled for Summer 2025.
- 33 CalWORKs students will either graduate, complete a certificate/degree, or transfer this semester.
- CalWORKs is partnering with El Camino's Kids College to provide childcare options for children of CalWORKs students, ages 5 to 12, enrolled for summer 2025 courses
- CalWORKs work-study will continue through the summer for work-study students who are enrolled in at

least 3 units. Also, we have positions to fill for Fall 2025 for eligible CalWORKs students.

Foster Youth Student Success

- Foster Care Awareness Month was a success. Each event fostered connection, reflection, and empowerment, and we look forward to continuing to uplift and support our foster youth students. Thank you for joining us!
- The Foster Youth Student Success team hosted an end-of-the-year celebration on May 28th to celebrate our students' achievements this academic year. 43 students attended. Activities included games, recognizing our graduating students, and enjoying warm food from Apple Spice. Each student received a service card. Graduating students received a certificate and graduation cord.
- 17 NextUp/Guardian Scholars will be graduating this semester. 9 students have been accepted and will be transferring to four-year universities to continue their education and pursue their career goals. We're very proud of their accomplishments and excited to see what the future holds for them!
- Guardian Scholars will be receiving an additional \$5,000 for the AY 2025- 2026 from John Burton Advocates for Youth so we can support students in meeting critical needs (examples of allowable uses include textbooks, school supplies, transportation expenses, emergency auto repairs, rent, etc.)
- The team is assisting students with enrollment for the summer and fall term.
