### FINANCIAL AID & BASIC NEEDS

- Financial Aid Disbursement Updates
  - Spring 2026 Pell – 1st Disbursement: Processed for 4,974 recipients totaling \$3,080,460. The batch was delivered Friday, February 20 to students with active BankMobile accounts.
  - Spring 2026 Pell – 2nd Disbursement: Processed for 5,618 recipients totaling \$4,269,659. The batch delivered Friday, March 13 to students with active BankMobile accounts.
  - Cal Grants: Currently on track to deliver next week, with a batch totaling approximately \$2,000,000.
  - Federal Loans: The first loan disbursement is scheduled to process approximately one week after the Cal Grant batch is completed.
    - Please note that the Financial Aid Office is also continuously processing smaller runs in between major disbursements to ensure students receive funds as quickly as possible.
- South Bay Promise
  - South Bay Promise is currently reviewing student records for those who have completed all Path to Enroll steps, have a FAFSA or CADAA on file, and are enrolled full-time for the Spring 2026 semester. Eligible students are being sent SBP Interest Emails prior to tentatively awarding a grant. The deadline for students to complete all required steps is April 27. - Financial Aid Outreach
  - During the month of March, our Outreach Specialists continue to expand financial aid access and support by:
  - Hosting Cash for College assistance every Tuesday and Wednesday from 3–6 p.m. in the Welcome Center
  - Facilitating weekly SAP Appeal workshops via Zoom
  - Hosting free scholarship webinars in collaboration with Sallie Mae
  - Providing off-campus financial aid workshops for community partners and prospective students
- Basic Needs Center
  - The Basic Needs Center continues to support students through:
    - Textbook assistance
    - Transportation support through the U-Pass program
    - Emergency financial assistance for housing support
- Warrior Pantry – February Highlights
  - Households Served: 816
  - Student Households: 336
  - Community Households: 480
  - Total Individuals Served: 3,439
  - Students: 2,697

- Food Distribution
  - Produce distributed (Food Forward): 14,196 lbs.
  - Items received from LARFB: 6,507 lbs.
- Warrior Resource Program (WRP)
  - 78 students received direct case management and individualized resource navigation during Winter and early Spring
  - 43 students served so far during the Spring semester
  - 18 students received emergency financial assistance
  - 62 service cards distributed to support essential needs
  - 32 students experiencing housing instability are currently receiving EveryTable meals
  - 9 housing referrals submitted to Harbor Interfaith
  - 20 students received Valentine's care packages through a community partner donation


- Spring term, we continue assisting students with the application process and current registration for Midterm classes.



## STUDENT SERVICES – TRIO SSS

- [TRIO Student Support Services](#) is ready to begin serving our El Camino College students! TRIO SSS is a federally funded program designed to support first-generation, low-income, and students with disabilities. We are here to guide students through degree completion and successfully transferring to a four-year university.
- To be eligible, you must be a U.S. Citizen or Permanent Resident and meet at least one of the following eligibility requirements:
  - Low income and/or first-generation college student. (*First-generation is defined as neither parent has obtained a Bachelor's Degree from a U.S. college or university.*)
  - Meet federal [income guidelines](#)
  - Documented Disability - Must be verified through appropriate documentation with El Camino's Special Resource Center
  - Demonstrate Academic Need - As determined by the TRIO program.
- Please encourage students to attend a [virtual information session](#) to learn more about the program.
- If you are working with a student and think they may be a good fit for the TRIO SSS program, please complete the following program referral form linked [HERE](#). The referral link will allow the team to connect with students directly.
- The recruitment strategy is to target students not already being supported by an existing support program on campus. This is a great opportunity for students who need additional guidance as they navigate their time at ECC.

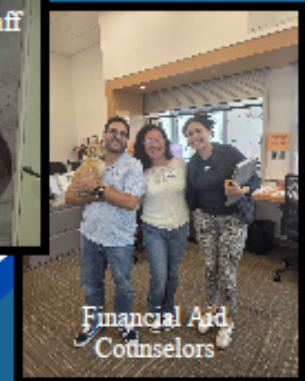
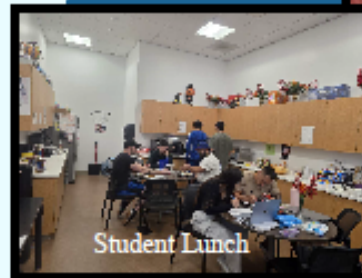
- Commencement Update
