Financial Aid

2024-2025:

- File Review opened for students selected for Verification on June 27 with the attached message (2024-25 Financial Aid Alert)
- About 4,000 students received this message
- Note: Financial aid switched to using the ProEd Solutions dashboard for verification, beginning with 2024-2025
- Note as the Financial Aid office reviews files, we are unable to submit updates to the Department of Education (ED) until mid-August; this is because ED systems have not been updated to receive batch corrections from schools.
- Due to the ED delays with 2024-2025 processing, financial aid applicants will be exempt from Drop for Nonpayment for Fall 2024
- For CA Dream Act applicants, we began processing applications beginning July number of applications are low so please help us help these students by encouraging them to apply for 2024-2025.

Summer 2024:

- Reminder that financial aid processing is manual and ongoing depending on the short-term summer courses
- Disbursement of summer aid is on a rolling basis with requirement that students must have at least 6 units of enrollment
- We are seeing and have receiving a high rate of Financial aid fraud cases for summer have stopped about \$150,000 Pell grant from disbursement

- <u>Closet</u>:
 - Due to an abundant supply of donations, we are unable to accept clothing items until September 3rd.
- Warrior Pantry:
 - Averaging 80 students per day
- CalFresh
 - Increase in the number students applying to Cal Fresh as a result of new eligibility criteria. Within
 increase we are seeing more student who qualify as a result of the LPIE (Local Programs that Increase
 Employability) programs. LPIE are government run programs that increase an enrolled student's
 employability.

EOPS

- EOPS/CARE is accepting applications for Fall 2024. Students can apply online at https://elcamino.formstack.com/workflows/eops care program application fa2 4
- EOPS Program Orientations are scheduled online and in-person on Mondays beginning July 15th (10-11 am, 12-1 pm, 3-4 pm); eligible students will be invited via email, text, and phone. We will include Fridays in September. During the EOPS program orientation, students are encouraged to complete our Early Start Interest form.
- Students who submitted an EOPS appeal will be notified of the appeal decision by July 22nd. Students will have until August 1, 2024, to meet with a counselor to be reinstated in the EOPS program.
- EOPS is actively promoting the Early Start program, which is taking place on Wednesday, August 7th from 9am-3pm. The goal of the EOPS Early Start program is to help incoming ECC EOPS students successfully transition to college and connect them with the services and campus resources they need to be successful college students. Associated Students Organization Updates

- The ASO graduated nearly 60 percent of its members from last year. Graduates plan to pursue studies at
 Northwestern, Stanford, Berkeley, UCLA, and other UC and CSU system schools. We are grateful for their service
 to the larger ECC community and I personally am grateful to all of you for your continued support of our

- ASO has begun the process of planning for 2024-2025 with a collective vision of <u>"Building a Stronger El Camino, Together"</u> through core tenets of *innovative programs*, active engagement, and comprehensive, student-facing, servant leadership.
- ASO meets this week to approve the FY 2024-2025 budget, highlighted by over \$62,000+ in allocations to ASO-Funded Programs, \$75,000+ to Inter-Club Council, and \$15,000 to CAUSE. ASO remains committed to ethical leadership and financial stewardship of student funds, as evidenced by over half of all ASO revenue being allocated to other campus entities.
- ASO will appoint nearly a dozen new members this week as well, bringing the collective ASO leadership so far to over 30 students.
- ASO is busy planning their inaugural Weeks of Welcome for Fall 2024, bringing over 15 events in the first 10 days of classes to campus. If you have an idea of a partnership with ASO, please contact asopresident@elcamino.edu.
