- The Appointment Request Form is available Monday and Tuesday. Students can call (310)660-3458, chat Monday through Thursday from 2:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. via LibChat, or stop by the Counseling front desk to schedule an appointment.

**CSEP Outreach:**

- Meta Major advisors conducted a 3 email campaign inviting students to schedule a counseling appointment to ensure students have a comprehensive educational plan (CSEP) on file, per Title 5 regulation
- Target audience: Educational goal is degree/certificate only or intend to transfer, not part of a cohort, start cohort is fall 2025, and no CSEP on file
- First messaging went out March 23
- Second messaging went out April 7
- Third messaging will go out on April 21
- The goal is to complete this first intervention prior to the start of registration. Additional follow-up is planned for the first group as well as intervention planning for incoming first year students.

**Start Strong Workshop:**

- A workshop dedicated for second semester first year non-cohorted students is planned for April. Targeted outreach will invite students to review topics such as ed plan retrieval, MyECC and registration review.

**First Semester Planning (FSP) Sessions Continue:**

- FSP's are for new students with 0 units completed, and those who have applied for Summer 2026 or Fall 2026 are invited to participate. During an FSP session, students meet with a counselor to receive course recommendations for their first semester. While waiting to meet with a counselor, advisors will discuss helpful tips to start the semester strong, including applying for financial aid, completing a career interest assessment, logging in to ECC Connect, and completing the Start Strong Survey. April 28-April 29 FSP's will be reserved for Health & Community Wellness (HCW) meta major students only, and May 5 FSP's for returning students with transcripts.

- Veterans gather bi-monthly at the VRC to connect, unwind, and enjoy board games together, a tradition that has proven both therapeutic and deeply engaging for participants. These sessions foster a strong sense of camaraderie and create natural opportunities for mentoring among peers.

- o Adding to the VRC's growing list of enrichment activities, veterans now have the opportunity to participate in guitar lessons. A representative from the VA Veterans Peer Access Network leads these bi-monthly sessions, offering veterans a creative and rewarding new skill to explore.
- **Credit for Prior Learning**

- **Intern South Bay Program – Summer 2026 Update**
  - The second-year application cycle for the Intern South Bay Program launched on March 3, 2026, with the application period running from March 3 through April 10. The program is scheduled to begin on June 22, 2026.
  - To support applicants, resume drop-in sessions were hosted Monday through Thursday from March 6 through April 8. Over 80 students attended these sessions, receiving guidance to strengthen and refine their resumes and overall application materials.
  - This year, we have 20 participating employers offering a diverse range of internship opportunities across multiple industries.

- A total of 332 students applied for the second year of the Intern South Bay program, demonstrating significant growth in student interest and engagement.

## OFFICE OF APPRENTICESHIPS

- EdPath Success programs engaged 45 students across both general and study cohorts, providing consistent academic and career support. Students participated in progress reviews, goal-setting meetings, and individualized guidance to help them stay on track and successfully complete their programs.
- The upcoming Earth Science and Green Tech Bootcamp is launching April 24. Recruitment efforts exceeded expectations, with 51 student applications, reflecting strong interest in STEM and sustainability-focused pathways.
- The Engineering Bootcamp engaged 10 students through weekly sessions, career workshops, and individualized support, fostering strong participation and skill development. As the program concludes on April 17, students are being supported to finish strong, with one-on-one feedback sessions planned.
- Students are actively progressing through the Aerospace Apprenticeship Summer Co-op application process. Serving 75 students through targeted support including information sessions, career counseling, academic and apprenticeship check-ins, and application assistance. Over 60 Summer 2026 interest forms have been received.

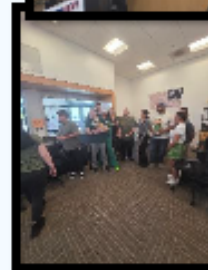
### Bi-Monthly Game Day/Guitar Lessons
