Basic Needs Center Fall Headcount Update

 As of Fall 2025, the Basic Needs Center has served 1,714 students. We have experienced a noticeable reduction in food resources from the Los Angeles Regional Food Bank, but our team remains committed to supporting students with the resources we have available and ensuring continued access to comprehensive basic needs services.

SPECIAL RESOURCE CENTER

Alt Media

- 13 scheduled meetings and assisted 24 students in accessing their approved alternate media accommodations. This represents a notable increase, as I typically support that number of students over the course of an entire semester.
- To date, have distributed 58 books and processed an additional 19 new titles to accessible formats in addition to creating enlarged and accessible documents for visually impaired students.
- Training two new student workers.
- Working publishers for Refrigeration and Air Conditioning program for access to required textbooks.

Deaf and Hard of Hearing

- Providing interpreting services for both students and staff.
- Mentoring interpreters newer in the field by setting them up with a seasoned interpreter.
- Guiding newer DHH students on navigating the SRC systems.
- Having active dialogue with both Specialists and Front Desk about identifying gaps in interdepartmental processes, i.e., ensuring all Deaf and Hard of Hearing Students have interpreters during meetings.

2 Spirits Documentary Screening

TWO SPIRITS is a powerful and emotionally resonant documentary that explores the intersection of identity, culture, and resistance within Native American and LGBTQIA+ communities. Centering on the tragic story of 16-year-old Fred Martinez — a Navajo youth who identified as nádleehí, a revered Two-Spirit identity embodying both feminine and masculine qualities — the film examines the deep historical roots of gender diversity in Indigenous cultures. Through interviews with family members, tribal leaders, activists, and scholars, TWO SPIRITS underscores both the beauty and resilience of Two-Spirit traditions and the ongoing harm caused by colonialism, racism, and anti-LGBTQIA+ violence. The documentary offers both a memorial and a call to action, reminding us that honoring Two-Spirit identities is essential to preserving Indigenous cultural heritage and protecting queer and trans lives today.
