2024-2025 Disbursement:

Spring Pell \$329,266 for 146 students
 Spring Loans \$40,646 for 20 students
 Fall Loans \$20,652 for 15 students
 Summer Pell \$2,495,465 for 1,788 students

2025-2026:

- South Bay Promise (SBP)
 - o PGP0: 250 potential new SBP recipients
 - Reminder communication to complete Orientation, Assessment, and/or Ed Plan; also need to be enrolled in 12+ units for Fall 2025
 - PGP1: 100 awarded with communication about eligibility to receive SBP at Fall 2025 census (12+ units); exemption will be placed so students with award will not be dropped for non-payment
 - SBP2: 190 awarded, continuing year 2 with communication about eligibility to receive SBP at Fall 2025 (12+ units), completion of 24+ units in year 1; exemption will be placed so students with award will not be dropped for non-payment

- Pell Grant Enrollment remains the same: Fulltime (12+), ¾ time (9-11.99), ½ time (6-8.99), and less than ½ time (<6)
 - New Workforce Pell program
 - Need Analysis:
 - Asset exemption family farm and small business are now exempt as aassets
 - Foreign Income included in AGI for the use of Pell Grant eligibility calculation
 - Full COA Scholarships/Grants No Pell if students receive scholarships and grants that cover all of their COA
 - High SAI- no Pell if SAI exceeds twice the maximum Pell
 - Various Loan Program Changes:
 - Parent PLUS loan and aggregate loan limits

- Institutionally Determined limits allows schools to determine lower limits based on academic program
- Loan proration based on the percentage of full-time status of the student borrower
- Loan Repayment lots of changes
- Institutional Accountability new measure that would determine school's loan program eligibility
- Majority of these new rules have effective date of July 1, 2026

Contact Center, Outreach and Warrior Welcome Center has combined forces and are collaborating and sharing student workers. This will allow us to attend more events and have more coverage for on-campus assistance and assist with more in-bound and out-bound calls.
