Guardian Scholars

- GSP has 65 active students 5 students are in the process of completing their counseling appointments
- We will have two career focused workshops for GSP students in the month of November;
 - o Resume Workshop on November 14 at 1pm via Zoom
 - o Mock Interviews on November 21 at 1pm in the Social Justice Center
- We have received the final grant of \$25,000 from the Pritzker Foster Care Initiative
- GSP is working to identify students for the JBAY Critical Needs Funds
- Teresa is currently working with 4 GSP students who are applying to transfer
- Teresa and Nicole are outreaching to 33 inactive students to re-engage them for Winter and Spring 2024.
- Book and Supply Vouchers for Fall 2023 have closed.

NextUP

• The EOPS application will be used as the central hub to connect students to the EOPS, CARE, and foster youth programs such as NextUP and Guardian Scholars.

Question 22 on the application has been updated: Are you a current or former foster youth whose dependency was established or continued by a court on or after your 13th birthday? *Please select yes, if you have experience in foster care, probation, Kinship Relative Care, etc.

- Helen and Roz are actively in the process of onboarding students for NextUP. They are working with a list of 60 prospective students that we have a NextUP preliminary determination for. These are students that have already been verified as foster youth by the financial aid office, meet the age criteria, and are enrolled at ECC this fall.
- Welcome Appointments include information about the NextUP program, educational planning, and a needs assessment.
- We are excited to announce that we will be welcoming a new NextUP Student Success Coach who will join
 Roz and provide support with case management and program activities to increase access, retention, and
 success of our foster youth students.

Student Development Office

- ASO now stands at 51 members active in the organization, the largest population of student leaders since 2015.
- ASO sent 6 students and 2 advisors to San Francisco for the CCCSAA Conference in late October. Advisor Tyler
 Strohl presented two sessions, one on campus leadership in advocacy and one on males in community colleges
 and keys to success.

- ASO participated in College Night welcoming new and prospective families.
- Hosted a Student Safety Presentation in collaboration with Student Health Services and Campus Police. Attendance was 30+.
- ASO collaborated with Basic Needs for Fall Harvest Festival, volunteering over 150+ hours of time and serving over 500 community members.
- ASO will send 22 students to the SSCCC Advocacy Academy in Riverside this weekend to learn about how to root our efforts in Advocacy.

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Program Spotlight





The Umoja Community provides "transformative" professional development to faculty, staff, students, and administrators. Colleges with Umoja programs must agree to maintain the core components of the Umoja Community to be an affiliated program. The core components include: participation in the full matriculation process, now mandated by the SSSP; designing an academic pathway, usually a learning community, which accelerates student progress to transfer directed status; and providing intrusive and wrap-around support services.

Dr. LaJoi Lewis from Student Health Services provided a tailored experience for our students. Her immense knowledge of the importance of journaling, breathing, and meditation were timely for this academic season of midterms and other life stressors.
