Student Services at El Camino College seeks to provide holistic student support that enables students to reach their full academic potential. Each month, we share updates from various departments on student services events, workshops, activities, services and number of students/staff/faculty served to enhance the student experience. FINANCIAL AID & BASIC NEEDS

- This will be the final month reporting combined Financial Aid & Basic Needs updates. Effective July 1, 2026, Basic Needs transitioned to the Workforce Readiness & Student Life Division. The Financial Aid Office will continue collaborating with Student Life to support students through financial aid services, emergency assistance programs, and student success initiatives.

Summer Financial Aid Processing

- Net Credit Processing Transition: The Financial Aid Office began transitioning to Net Credit Processing (NCP) during Summer 2026 as part of a phased implementation. Beginning in Fall 2026, Net Credit Processing will be fully implemented for all eligible students.
- To date, two Pell Grant batches have been processed totaling \$649,127 in financial aid for 369 recipients. Eligible institutional charges were paid through financial aid disbursements, and any remaining funds were issued to students through BankMobile.
- The implementation of Net Credit Refunds resulted in processing delays that impacted the timing of Summer disbursements. These delays created a domino effect affecting other student payments, including students owed funds from prior terms and students enrolled in late-start classes.
- To improve the student experience, the Financial Aid Office will implement new Summer disbursement procedures beginning Summer 2027. Summer disbursements will be divided into two equal payments, allowing eligible students to access available funds at the start of their first Summer class, regardless of whether they have additional late-start classes later in the term.
- Fall 2026 Net Credit Refund Implementation: Net Credit Refunds will be fully implemented beginning Fall 2026. Students with outstanding institutional fees who are eligible for financial aid will have eligible charges paid through their financial aid, and any remaining funds will be issued to the student as a refund through BankMobile.
- Students can review additional information and frequently asked questions regarding Net Credit Processing on the Financial Aid website. The FAQ section located at the bottom of the webpage provides additional guidance on how financial aid is applied to eligible charges and how remaining funds are issued to students through BankMobile.
- Students with questions regarding their financial aid status are encouraged to review their outstanding requirements in the student portal and contact the Financial Aid Office for assistance.

Student Forms & Online Services

- Student Forms Implementation: The Financial Aid Office continues supporting the transition to Ellucian Student Forms for verification documentation. This new process provides students with a more streamlined way to submit required financial aid documents electronically.
- Staff continue improving online forms and communication processes to make it easier for students to complete financial aid requirements.

Satisfactory Academic Progress (SAP) Updates

- SAP Evaluation Timeline: The SAP evaluation deadline was extended to July 30, 2026, due to nearly 4,000 outstanding Report Delayed (RD) grades that impacted the accuracy of SAP calculations.
- After additional grade processing, the number of outstanding RD grades decreased to approximately 900 when the SAP calculation was completed on July 9, 2026. The extension allowed the Financial Aid Office to provide students with more accurate SAP eligibility determinations.

Federal Student Loan Education

- Required Federal Student Loan Workshops: Beginning August 10, 2026, the Financial Aid Office will offer required Federal Student Loan Workshops for students interested in requesting federal student loans. Workshops will be offered in person only to ensure students receive important information regarding borrowing responsibilities, loan eligibility requirements, aggregate loan limits, and repayment obligations.
- The Federal Student Loan Workshop request form will be available on the Financial Aid website at the end of July. Students must complete the required workshop before they can formally submit a request for a federal student loan.
- If a student has a valid reason they are unable to attend an in-person workshop, the Financial Aid Office will work with the student to provide a reasonable accommodation.

Basic Needs Collaboration

- Basic Needs Transition: Effective July 1, 2026, Basic Needs services transitioned to the Workforce Readiness & Student Life Division. The Financial Aid Office continues partnering with Basic Needs to support students through emergency assistance programs, including the awarding and disbursement of emergency funds.
- Student Housing Pilot Program: The Financial Aid Office continues working in partnership with Basic Needs to support the Summer 2026 Student Housing Pilot Program by processing and disbursing emergency assistance funds to eligible students.
- Metro U-Pass Access: Students can now request their Metro U-Pass directly through the Basic Needs Center located in The ECC Commons. Students no longer need to visit the Bookstore or wait in the Cashier's line to obtain their pass. Eligible students can apply and receive their U-Pass the same day.

Warrior Resource Program (WRP) Update

- Open Door Summer Housing Stipend: Received 36 student applications for the Summer Housing Stipend program to support students with housing-related needs.
- Emergency Service Cards: Provided 17 students with emergency service cards. Distribution was limited due to available inventory.
- Housing Referrals: Referred 5 students to Harbor Interfaith for additional housing support and resources.
- Book Support: 21 students were unable to receive textbook assistance due to the transition period and delays associated with Business Process Owner (BPO) setup.
- WRP Peer Mentors: Two student worker positions have been approved. One student worker has started, and the second position is pending completion of the HR process.
- EveryTable Meal Support: 30 students are currently receiving meal support through the EveryTable partnership.

Fall 2026 Preparation

- The Financial Aid Office continues preparing for Fall 2026, including finalizing financial aid awards, processing SAP appeals after census, supporting students with outstanding requirements, and enhancing student communication.

Appointments resume!

- Meta major counseling appointment scheduling has resumed. Appointments open up each Monday for the following week and are typically scheduled one week in advance.
- The Appointment Request Form is currently closed and will reopen soon. Students can call (310)660-3458, chat Monday through Thursday from 2:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. via LibChat, or stop by the Counseling front desk to schedule an appointment.

FSP's continue:

- First Semester Planning (FSP) sessions continue every Tuesday and Wednesday until August 11, 2026. FSP's are for new students with 0 units completed. During an FSP session, students will meet with a counselor to receive course recommendations for their first semester and register for classes. While waiting to meet with a counselor, advisors review the Getting Started Checklist with students, which includes helpful tips to start the semester strong, applying for financial aid, completing a career interest assessment, logging in to ECC Connect, and completing the Start Strong Survey.

Start Strong Workshop:

- [The Start Strong Workshop](#) is designed to help first-time college students feel confident and prepared for their first semester. During a Start Strong Workshop, students will learn how to navigate El Camino's key resources, stay on track academically, and connect with programs and support services.

EOPS

- EOPS is accepting applications for Fall 2026.

- EOPS is accepting new students for [Early Start 2026](#), which will be held August 4th and 5th, to prepare incoming students with the resources and services that could help them meet their educational goals during their time in EOPS and ECC.
- Hosting an Open House within the first week of the fall semester for all incoming students who potentially qualify for EOPS.

CARE

- **CARE Program Student Experience Survey:** As the Spring 2026 semester concluded, the CARE Program administered a student experience survey to gather valuable feedback from participants. The survey focused on identifying opportunities for program improvement, assessing unmet student needs, and exploring interests for future workshops and events. The CARE team looks forward to using this feedback to enhance programming and better support the parenting students served by the program.
- **CARE Program Renewal for Current Participants:** Effective July 1, 2026, all continuing CARE students were required to renew their program eligibility for the Fall 2026 semester. To maintain active participation, students must submit an updated CARE Certification Form and verification of benefits (VOB). CARE services remain on hold until the renewal process is completed and eligibility is confirmed.
- **Accepting New CARE Students:** The CARE Program will begin onboarding new eligible students on July 20, 2026. Early onboarding is being encouraged so that new participants can take part in the Fall 2026

CARE and CalWORKs Kickoff Event on September 4, 2026. Students interested in joining CARE must first be admitted to the [Extended Opportunity Programs and Services \(EOPS\) Program](#). CalWORKs

- **Federal Work-Study (FWS) Job Request Form Now Open:** The **2026–2027 FWS Job Request Form** opened on **July 1**, allowing students to apply for CalWORKs Work-Study (CWWS)/Federal Work-Study (FWS) campus employment opportunities. The CalWORKs team is actively promoting these positions to eligible students as an excellent opportunity to gain valuable work experience and professional development while earning county-exempt income. We are also encouraging campus departments to consider hiring CalWORKs Work-Study-eligible students, as these students may qualify for additional grant funding that can help departments maximize their student employment resources.

Intern South Bay Summer 2026

- The **Intern South Bay Summer 2026** program continues to provide meaningful paid internship opportunities for El Camino College students across the South Bay region, strengthening career pathways and preparing students for future careers.

Program Highlights

- **35 students** are participating in paid internships this summer and are currently in **Week 5 of the 8-week program**, with internships scheduled to conclude in mid-August.
- Internships officially began on **June 22, 2026**. As students near the completion of their internships, employer evaluations have been overwhelmingly positive, highlighting students' professionalism, strong work ethic, initiative, and valuable contributions to their organizations.
- Students have participated in **two mandatory Professional Development Workshops** focused on workplace success, including topics such as **Personal Branding, Leadership Skills, and Professional Boundaries**, helping them develop the essential skills needed to thrive in professional environments.
- The program continues to strengthen students' **career readiness, professional development, mentorship, and networking opportunities** while expanding partnerships with employers throughout the South Bay region.
- Through these experiences, students are building valuable workplace skills, exploring career pathways, and developing professional connections that will support their long-term academic and career success.

Apprenticeships

- EdPath Success Summer program is underway with 15 students
- Early Childhood Education: The New ECE apprenticeship program is launching Fall '26 with six registered apprentices at Volunteers of America.
- Engineering Technician Apprentice: 200 applicants for five new apprentices at our newest apprenticeship partner, Ontic Engineering & Manufacturing. Interviews and selection are currently underway.

- In partnership with Financial Aid and Basic Needs provided the following assistance:
 - Open Door Summer Housing Stipend: 45 student applications received. (Just a quick note: When I submitted this information to David, there were only 36 applications at that time).
 - Service Cards: 17 students received emergency service cards (limited due to low inventory).
 - Emergency Funds: 3 students received emergency financial assistance during the summer.
 - Housing Referrals: 5 students were referred to Harbor Interfaith.
 - Book Support: 21 students were unable to receive textbook assistance due to the department transition and delays with the BPO setup.
 - WRP Peer Mentors: Two student workers have been approved; one has started and the other is pending HR.
