U.S. News & World Report ranks UCF among the nation's most innovative universities along with Harvard, Stanford and Duke. *The Washington Post* credits UCF with leading a "national insurgency that aims to demolish the popular belief that exclusivity is a virtue in higher education."

Our nearly 2,500 faculty members have made that possible. During the past three years, UCF has established more than 245 new faculty positions, nearly all of them tenured or tenure track. They've strengthened the university in a variety of fields, supported high-growth programs and added new interdisciplinary faculty clusters.

Our faculty are also deeply involved in continuing UCF's success by supporting the university's Collective Impact Strategic Plan. Those goals focus on increasing measures that already are trending upward, including the number of graduate students, tenured faculty, research degrees and research grants.

The power of scale and the pursuit of excellence make a better future for our students and society. Bill Gates describes UCF as pioneering in its efforts to "expand access to students of all economic backgrounds and provide them a high-quality, affordable education." UCF values diversity and our enrollment shows it: 46 percent of our students are minorities. We are an emerging Hispanic-Serving Institution with Hispanic students making up 26 percent of our enrollment.

The impact of this approach is shown in the success of our students.

The average GPA of incoming freshmen for fall 2017 was a school-record 4.06. UCF ranks 13th among U.S. public universities for enrolling National Merit Scholars, and welcomed a school-record 88 to campus in the fall.

UCF holds the Carnegie Foundation's highest designation in two categories: community engagement and very high research activity. Kiplinger ranks us a national best-value university. At UCF, 44 percent of students graduate without any educational debt. Nationally, 34 percent of students graduate debt-free.

UCF and our 13 colleges offer 216 degrees from UCF's main campus, hospitality campus, health sciences campus, online and through our 10 regional locations. The university offers 95 bachelor's and 87 master's degrees, 28 research doctorates, three professional doctorates and three specialist degree programs.

More than 11,000 students live on UCF's 1,415-acre main campus and in UCF-affiliated or UCF-managed housing next to campus. The campus is adjacent to one of the top research parks in the nation and anchors the state's nearly \$5 billion modeling and simulation industry.

UCF's fully online programs include bachelor's degrees, graduate degrees, graduate certificates and more.

UCF also includes a fully accredited College of Medicine in the Medical City at Lake Nona and has received

state approval for a university medical center adjacent to the medical school in partnership with Hospital Corporation of America. Plans are underway to open a cutting-edge cancer research and treatment facility.

Our footprint will expand further in 2019, when a new campus opens in downtown Orlando with 7,700 students in partnership with Valencia College. UCF Downtown expands our commitment in Orlando, a city with thriving tech and arts scenes and a young, well-educated and diverse population of more than 1.2 million people.

Partnerships like those at our health and downtown campuses are deeply ingrained in UCF's culture. We partner with business, government, nonprofits and other educational institutions because we know that when we work together, we are all better for it. Our approach has brought new facilities, better opportunities for students and faculty, and a stronger region.

UCF employs more than 12,000 people and operates on a budget of \$1.7 billion. In FY 2017, UCF earned \$136 million in research funding.

Donors have helped the university raise more than \$385 million toward IGNITE: The Campaign for UCF's \$500 million fundraising goal. The campaign, focused on student success, academic excellence, and growth and opportunity, concludes in 2019. The UCF Foundation manages an endowment of more than \$160 million, as of June 2018.

The provost chairs the university's budget committee and, in consultation with the president, is responsible for the university's annual budget. JUNTOS 4-H

Targeting Latino Students And Helping Them Get Into College

Juntos 4-H employs several strategies including a week-long or weekend summer workshop on a college campus, one-on-one mentoring, and workshops on such topics as financial aid for both students and their parents.

The 4-H Club has always been devoted to youth development. But a specialized program, Juntos 4-H that launched in 2015, is preparing Latino students in eighth to twelfth grades, in collaboration with their parents, to apply for and gain acceptance into college. Juntos means “together” in Spanish, and that name was selected because the program connects Latino youth and their families with mentors and colleges.

One of its primary goals is for the 4-H Club to develop more effective relationships with the Latino community. The program launched at North Carolina State University in 2007 and morphed into Juntos 4-H in 2015.

Between 2015 and 2017, it enrolled 400 students from Texas, New York and Florida (though it operates in many other

states including California, Arizona and Illinois). A survey of those students revealed that 87 percent of participants felt they belonged in school, and 91 percent of them saw their grades improve.

Jennifer Sirangelo, president and CEO of the National 4-H Council, has said, “Research shows that Latino youth are at the greatest risk of dropping out of schools between the ninth and tenth grades.” The program is sponsored by the National 4-H Council and was supported by a \$1.5 million grant from the New York Life Foundation.

Multiple Strategies

Juntos 4-H employs several strategies including a week-long or weekend summer workshop on a college campus, one-on-one mentoring, and workshops on such topics as financial aid for both stu-

dents and their parents. Most first-generation Latino parents, who aren’t college graduates, can become overwhelmed by the complexity of applying for financial aid and filling out college applications.

Lupita Fabregas, coordinator of Juntos 4-H in California, explained that “You can’t achieve a full potential without a better education, and that’s what we want to do in 4-H. First, they have to graduate college and then pursue a career.”

But in California the need to instill a desire for post-high school education is sorely needed. Fabregas notes that in California 52 percent of students attending K-12 public schools are Latino, 35 percent of them are enrolled in two or four-year colleges, but only 15 percent of Latinos aged 25 to 29 have a bachelor’s degree according to the Pew Research Center in 2016.

locations. The university offers 95 bachelor's and 87 master's degrees, 28 research doctorates, three professional doctorates and three specialist degree programs. 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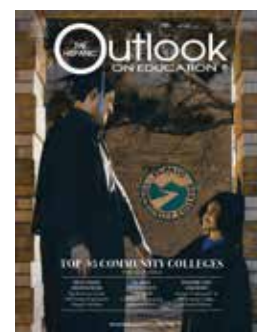
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
