WHAT IS RACC?

The Regional Admission Counselors of California (RACC) is an organization comprised of 175 admission professionals from nearly 120 institutions outside of California who work with students, their families, and counselors throughout California. All of these out-of-state institutions are NACAC and/or WACAC members. They have dedicated the necessary resources for a regional office to serve California schools and provide information about educational opportunities outside of California.

In addition to participating in your school, district, or organization's outreach programs, RACC has developed signature programs, including:

Promoting Out-of-State Educational Opportunities for Californians

This program includes a short presentation about the many advantages that exist at out-of-state institutions for California students and a mini-college fair. In addition, each participating RACC member presents a brief institutional overview. This program typically takes place in the evening, allowing parents to attend.

RACC Mini-College Fairs

You provide the tables and the location (such as a classroom, library, quad, gymnasium, or cafeteria) and the RACC members will bring their table banners, colorful materials, and plenty of smiles.

RACC Case Studies

RACC has created three terrific applicants as examples to help guide students and parents through the Admission Committee stage of the application cycle. Admission professionals who have read thousands of applications, letters of recommendations, and essays developed these applicants. Each of our applicants has strengths and weaknesses, which with the guidance of a group facilitator, really help the participants better understand the application process. Our goal is to have the students and their parents experience a less stressful application process.

RACC Application Boot Camps

Our newest service has become a much talked-about resource. Students have an opportunity to work in small groups with an admission officer to polish their essays and interview skills. We often add other topics as requested by the high school. Some of these topics include Early Action vs Regular Decision, the importance of demonstrated interest, how to write a good resume, etc.

RACC Speakers

Additionally, many RACC members are available to speak or present on a variety of a topics at college nights, parent nights, admissions panels, or individual classes (such as Avid or Upward Bound). Some of these topics include: out-ofstate college options, how to write a college essay, ACT/SAT general information and strategies, choosing a major, financial aid, selecting a college, WUE, the differences between a public and private university, the importance of demonstrated interest, how to get the most out of college tours, how to rock your admissions interview, etc.

With its roots in both French and Spanish heritage and a strong influence from the Acadians (known today as the Cajuns) the state has a colorful history and flair. The language, food, music, festivals (such as Mardi Gras), outdoor activities, and the varying backgrounds of its people create a fascinating melting pot of cultures. History runs deep, as there are more sites in Louisiana on the National Register of Historic Places than in any other state.






