Transfer Requirements

The following requirements for the major are subject to change without notice. To assure accuracy of the information on this sheet, you should consult with an administration of justice counselor, the articulation officer, or review articulation agreements via the internet at www.assist.org.

CAREER OPPORTUNITIES:

Several options are available to administration of justice graduates. Law Enforcement programs prepare individuals for careers at the federal, state and local levels of government as well as in business and industry (e.g. a city Police Department, State Narcotics Enforcement Bureau, and U.S. Department of Justice, private police firm.) Corrections programs are for students interested in careers in probation, parole, penal and correctional institutions. The Criminalistics option emphasizes scientific criminal investigation techniques, as needed by identification and laboratory technicians. Training beyond the bachelor's degree may be necessary. Security Administration emphasizes industrial and security agency approaches (e.g. airport, schools, and public housing.)

ADMINISTRATION OF JUSTICE - A.A. DEGREE AND CERTIFICATE OF ACHIEVEMENT

El Camino College Major Requirements: AJ 100, 103, 115, 130, 131, 135, 170;

Plus a minimum of six additional units from the following: AJ 70, 95/96abcd, 106, 107, 109, 111, 126, 132, 133, 134, 150. Total number of units 27-32. At least 50% of the major requirements must be completed at El Camino

IMPACTED – impacted major admission requirements must be completed by the end of the spring semester for fall admission consideration. Students should check the impacted majors' website for additional admissions information. Grades of C or better are required for the major requirements.

B.S. in Criminal Justice IMPACTED- It is recommended that students complete and ADT, however, transfer students not completing the ADT must complete: AJ 100, 103, 107; students must complete AJ 100 and 103 with grades of B or better .

Complete the pre-major courses with a C or better. Students need to have a cumulative GPA of 2.60 for admission to the major.
