TYPE OF CRIME:	Stalking
DATE OF INCIDENT:	10/10/2024
LOCATION:	Library/Bus Stop (Crenshaw/Redondo Beach Blvd)
SYNOPSIS:	<p>On Tuesday, October 15, 2024, ECCPD confirmed information of a male student who had been reportedly approaching female Japanese students on campus with unsolicited invitations and overtures.</p> <p>ECCPD received a report of an incident that took place on Oct. 10, 2024, involving a female Japanese student who was followed by a male student from the campus library to a bus stop on Redondo Beach and Crenshaw Boulevards. The male student proceeded to ask her out on a date. The female student boarded the bus without acknowledging the male student.</p> <p>On Oct. 11, the male student made contact with the same female again at the same bus stop and asked her out on a date again, with the same result. On Oct. 15, ECCPD was further informed that additional female Japanese students were also contacted by the same male student.</p> <p>ECCPD is investigating this matter and is conducting extra patrols throughout campus.</p> <p>It is always advised that students and employees use the ECC Courtesy Shuttle operated by ECC Police; on-call 24 hours. ECC police can be reached by using the emergency phones located throughout campus or call 310-660-3100.</p>
SUSPECT INFORMATION:	<p>The individual was described as male, in his late twenties, dark colored hair, and dark colored eyes. The individual's self-identified ethnicity is non-Hispanic. His self-identified race is Black/African American and Japanese.</p>

El Camino College Police Department Recommendations For Your Safety - Stalking:

- Trust your instincts - If you notice something that doesn't feel right, it probably isn't.
- If you see something, say something. By working together we all contribute to the safety of our campus.

- In an emergency, contact Campus Police by calling 911 from a landline phone, 310-660-3100 from a cell phone, or use a campus “Code Blue” emergency phone.
- Have keys in hand before walking to your car.
- Always be aware of your surroundings. Remember the use cell phones may significantly distract you
- Don’t walk alone. Use the buddy system.
- Know your resources- Know who to contact and where you should go if you or a friend needs help. Notice where emergency phones are located on campus and program the Campus Police Department phone number into your cell phone for easy access.
- Night students and faculty are encouraged to park in the same general area as other faculty or students with night classes in their building. This provides the opportunity for a group of students and faculty to walk together to their cars after dark.
- Immediately report any suspicious activity to campus police.
- Be alert! Be prepared!
